STUDENT ABSENCES

If a student is absent for any reason, the school must be notified either by phone, text or a flexibuzz message.

If you know about an absence in advance, please communicate with the classroom teacher or use one of the methods mentioned above. When planning a family holiday or similar which will see you child away for a week or more, please see admin staff for an exemption form. This must be approved by the Principal before the holiday.

If a student arrives at school late (after the 8:45am bell) the child or their accompanying adult needs to sign in at the front office. Children departing early must be signed out at the office by their accompanying adult. Our front office staff can assist with the new sign in / out system.

Welcome to new students, and to the regulars. This year we have a ton of things to do in music which you'll get to hear about at the Meet and Greet in week 3.

<u>Classroom Term 1 Summary</u> Reception – Year 1

Rhythm/ Beat, Tempo, Pitch and Notation. We will be about learning note types and percussion instruments.

Year 1-2

Listening for texture (thick and thin sounds) and dynamics. Students will learn call and response songs and ostinatos (rounds) to develop pitch.

Year 2-3

Learn about composition, notes and develop rhythm to prepare them for a song in term 2!

Year 3-4

Expand on clefs and learn about notes on a stave, how to repeat and how to tell other people when to get louder and softer. We will listen to music in 3/4 (waltz) and 4/4 (most pop songs) to learn how we can tell the difference.

Year 4-5

Revise notes, symbols, clefs and dynamics. We will learn about the C Major scale and blues chord progressions in term 2.

Year 5-6

Revise concepts and skills to lead into isolating tones and semitones. We will work on our aural skills so that we can identify elements of music within songs that we know and love.

Year 7

Learning about tones and semitones and creating scales. Learn about the instruments we have in the room.

Festival of Music Choir

Instrumental Ensemble

Students who are learning an instrument inside and outside of school attended an Instrumental Ensemble meeting this week. Students discussed their options and what will be available to them if they attend. Those who showed interest will receive sheet music to look over/practice with their tutors and bring back in week 3.

Vocal Ensemble

Auditions will start Week 2. Students have already started filling out the audition forms hanging from the music room window. If you are interested, please put in your form no later than Tuesday week 2, so that I can organise an audition timeslot for you. For the audition, you will need to choose a song that you are confident to sing. Please bring the backing track, or let me know if the music is in the music room.


