Every three years data about the development of young children in their first year of Reception is gathered through the Australian Early Development Census.
Teachers complete information in five key areas of early childhood development: physical health and wellbeing , social competence, emotional maturity, language and cognitive skills (schoolbased) and communication skills and general knowledge.

It is believed that these areas are closely linked to the predictors of adult health, education and social outcomes.

THE MASK CALLED ANGER
Anger is no different than any other feeling, and it is ok to be angry, just as it is ok to have the lighter feelings of happiness or excitement. We don't usually respond when we are angry but react. How we react when we are angry can have huge consequences and affect us much longer.
Anger may be the emotion that is shown, but usually it is a cover for other emotions that our children may want to disguise because it may be uncomfortable, or they do not know how to express their true feelings.
Some of these feelings may be sadness, fear, jealously, frustration and guilt. It is easier to express being angry than to work through these other emotions and some of our children do not have the vocabulary or knowledge of what these emotions are.
When a situation has risen, and an adult asks, "What's the matter?" "How do you feel?" most children will reply "'m mad or angry." It is their "go to" response; Next time this is their response ask them again "What else do you feel?" and encourage them to explore other feelings.
When we help our children to 1. Understand, 2. Acknowledge and 3. Validate these other feelings it is then they are able to work through the core issue a lot quicker with less confusion and even lesser consequences.
