Upper Primary Students run lunchtime activities (Play **A**t Lunchtime PAL) for students of all ages to enjoy.


Student leaders run our SIM (Student Information) assemblies in odd weeks. They are responsible for delivering key school messages and sharing information with students about what happening in the school.

OCCASIONAL BUS TRAVELLERS



If your child wishes to travel on a bus to another person's residence (a one-off) then we require a note from you with emergency contact details

and a signature. It then needs to be taken to the front office to be stamped and signed and a temporary bus tag number given, if necessary. This needs to occur at least one day prior to travel to ensure that there is a seat available.

If it is more than a one night or morning event then the student will need to get a bus enrolment form which must be completed prior to the beginning of the travel period.

Dear Parent/Guardian

Re: Wellbeing and Engagement Collection

Students in our school have been invited to take part in a survey being conducted in Term 3. This letter provides key information about the survey.

Purpose of the collection

Young people's sense of wellbeing is an important part of their development and how they learn at school. The purpose of the survey is to seek students' views about their wellbeing and their engagement with school. Students in year levels 4 to 9 will participate in the Wellbeing and Engagement Collection. The information collected will help inform work in the education system and broader community to help improve young people's health and wellbeing.

What is the survey about?

The survey asks students about their social and emotional wellbeing; school relationships and engagement and learning in school; and physical health and wellbeing and after school activities. Students' answers will be kept confidential – no one will use the results to identify individual students.

What is involved in project participation?

Teachers will arrange for students to undertake the survey during class time. Students will be asked if they would like to participate and will be free to withdraw at any time. If you do not want your child to participate, please contact the school by 30 July 2018 or as soon as possible after receiving this letter.

Will students' information be kept confidential?

Students' answers to the survey will be kept confidential

Results will not be used to identify individual students

Will schools, classes or students be "ranked" in any way?

No. The findings will not be used to rank or determine the performance of schools.

commented that they would like some more saucepans and spoons.




