OCCASIONAL BUS TRAVELLERS



If your child wishes to travel on a bus to another person's residence (a one-off) then we require a note from you with emergency contact details and a signature. It

then needs to be taken to the front office to be stamped and signed and a temporary bus tag number given, if necessary. This needs to occur at least one day prior to travel to ensure that there is a seat available.

If it is more than a one night or morning event then the student will need to get a bus enrolment form which must be completed prior to the beginning of the travel period.





How many dinosaurs altogether?










