CLASSES 2019

Structures

We are currently working on class structures for 2019. It is critical that we know your intentions for 2019 in order to have class numbers as accurate as possible. Please give me a ring or send a text / email if your children will not be attending Balaklava Primary next year, or alternatively, if you know of anyone moving into the area.

Placements

The class placement process will begin as soon as we have the structures in place. This process is completed over a number of weeks and staff work hard to ensure we place students carefully in regards to class size and structure. We also try to ensure we put together groups of students who will work and learn well together.

To do this we consider:

- The learning needs of each child
- A good balance of boys and girls and learning abilities
- Each child's friendship needs

Teachers will give strong consideration to each child's friendship needs. If friends do not work well together, teachers may decide not to put them into the same class. School is a time to learn to develop new friendships. A new class and a new school year is an ideal time to make new friends.

A few children have very special learning or health needs. If you believe that your child has very special needs, we will strive to do our very best to take this into consideration when we finalize classes, but due to a range of complexities, this may not always be possible.

While we welcome letters regarding other parental considerations, we must stress that request will be considered but are not always possible. We ask that you do not request specific teachers. Staffing for 2019 has not yet been confirmed.

The last known words of Cpl Cameron Baird, penned in a letter to a Sydney teen, sum up so beautifully what should be the life goal of all of us, and especially of those children we educate and raise.

Cpl Baird was an Australian Commando who was killed in action in Uruzgan province, Afghanistan in 2013. He was awarded a Victoria Cross posthumously for his incredible leadership, bravery and self-sacrifice in combat. In the letter, Cpl Baird encourages the young teen to chase his dreams, work hard, and to face challenges with the "mindset of a soldier: do or die".

I feel that this is a valuable lesson for us all. As you travel through the coming days and weeks, let this message sink in. Try your best, be happy in life, chase your dreams, and meet challenges head on.

SCHOOL MATERIAL & SERVICE CHARGE 2019

The procedures for School Charges for 2019 remain as they have for the past years. The Material & Service charge, of \$260 per student, was approved by the Department for Education and then ratified at Governing Council Tuesday night.

To enable parents to pay for the M&S Charge prior to the commencement of the school year, the office will be open on Wednesday 23rd January and Thursday 24th January 2019 times to be confirmed. These are our Registration Days. Bags, hats, dresses and second uniform items will be for sale, along with opportunity to collect a class stationery/ information pack. (Balaklava High School will be open on these days also). All credit cards are accepted along with cash and cheques for payment of the fees. EFTPOS facilities are available. Fees are payable using our QKR app for mobile phones also. If you will be away on these days, you can still make payment and packs will be put aside ready for the first morning of school.

For those who are eligible for School Card, procedures have remained the same as last year i.e., both parents whose names appear on cards need to sign the form. Income limits and eligibility are based on the 2017/2018 financial year. The following table indicates eligible limits which applied for the 2018 year, which may be a guide for those who will be applying.

The eligibility criterion for the 2019 School Card Scheme is based on whether the applicant's combined family gross income is within the School Card income limits.

Eligibility is not dependent on any member of the family receiving any Centrelink benefits or Family Tax benefits.

There are many different application forms for School Card. All forms will be available from the front office. "A" forms will be sent out Should you need further information, please contact the School Office on 88621660 in the new year and we will provide the updated information.

OPTIONS FOR PAYING M&S FEES & INVOICES

In 2019 we will continue to offer multiple ways to pay items which are associated with the school, i.e., school fees, camps etc. Listed below are some of these options:

- Payment can be made *in person* with either *cash, cheque or EFTPOS* at the Front Office.
- Payments can be made by filling out the credit card details at the bottom of your invoice along with the 3 digit CSV on the rear of the card and returning to the school for processing.
- Payments can be made over the phone using *credit or debit card* details.
- If you believe you are entitled to School Card, you MUST fill out a form EACH year (cut-off date will be 15th November 2019) and submit it to the school or to the School Card Section. Forms and details available at Front Office. If you have students at different schools ie Primary School and High School, a form must be submitted to BOTH schools.







TREE of KINDNESS










We have planted our Tree of Kindness in the assembly area of the OSU.
