Enrol now at Balaklava kindy and childcare

Did you know any child May 1, 2019, is eligible to start kindy in the last week of January 2019?

And any child with special circumstances may also be able to start from three years of age, so it is worth checking with the director at Balaklava Community Children's

Parents may not be aware preschool enrolments are now offered to families in August, the year before their child starts.

A new process, based on turning four years old before a geographical boundary surrounding preschools, was introduced in 2017.

> This means families need to register with the kindy of their choice as early as pos-

> Families, whose residential address is not within the kindy's geographical boundary, may be offered a placement in September if they meet the priority of access requirements.

Balaklava Community Children's Centre (BCCC) is also very excited to be able to take names for long day care bookings in 2019.

Waiting list applications are available from the Centre, 15 Scotland Street, Balaklava.

The new building extension at BCCC is scheduled to be completed and fully operational by January 2019, featuring an additional 21 childcare places each day, for 50 weeks of the year.
