

THEREare nearly 355,000 Australians living with dementia, with 25,000 of them residing in SA. Statistics indicate more than 500 are diagnosed with the disease every week.

There are also 25,000 with Younger Onset Disease which effects people under the age of 65.

September is Dementia Awareness Month and the Seniors Collaborative Action Project (SCAP) has organised a "Pop-Up Expo Roadshow" in the region to raise awareness and assure people "You are not alone."

The Roadshow will travel around the region on September 20 and 22, popping up at a number of towns for an hour or so to provide information about the services and supports available for people with dementia and their families/carers.

On tour will be Alzheimer's Australia's Dementia Link Worker, Aged Rights Advocacy Service, Barossa Village, Carers' Link, Country Home Services, KinCare, SA Country Carers, Tanunda Lutheran Home and Uniting Communities.

Expo organiser, Deb Anderson, said she was really pleased with the response from service providers.

"We really want to get the message out there that people don't have to 'just cope' with this disease - you are not alone," Deb said.

"There are services available that can support you and your loved ones."

SCAP is also very appreciative of various store owners who are hosting the Pop-Up Expo in each town, and of the support for the initiative from Country SA PHN which exists to bridge the gap of health inequity and access in rural South Australia.
