SCHOOL BADGE CHALLENGE

School Badge Challenge and Children's University Australia



Children's University Australia provides extra-curricular learning opportunities to children aged between 7 and 14 years old, and volunteer opportunities for 15-18 year olds; the aim being to engage children in learning in its broadest sense and to provide the scaffolding for children to develop self-efficacy, confidence and aspirations.

The Children's University concept is relatively simple: it recognises superior educational experiences for children outside of school and acknowledges their achievements through the award of formal certificates. The model leverages local educational and learning activity providers, including sports clubs, museums, galleries, and school clubs. A strong emphasis is placed on acknowledging the value of accessing the wide range of learning experiences and environments in which children engage. These learning activities must have a link in some way to higher learning, for example, participation in a football club linking to physiotherapy, sports science or even personal training.

Children's University is child directed; in that each child chooses to be involved and picks what they would like to participate in. Children are encouraged to explore and discover new ideas, concepts and experiences. The activities are practical, fun based and voluntary and could range from afterschool clubs, (restricted Learning Destinations), to museums, community activities, theatres, in parks and galleries, at television stations... the list is endless!

Each child is issued with a Children's University Passport to Learning in which the hours of each activity are recorded. Credits are accumulated, and when they reach the hours needed to graduate from the Children's University, children are awarded with certificates at a formal graduation ceremony held in high profile locations, such as Bonython Hall at the University of Adelaide. Graduation levels are gold, silver and bronze and range from Diploma to Doctorate.

A selection of School Badge Challenges are validated by Children's University Australia (CUA). CUA members can count hours spent on the challenges marked with the CUA logo in their CUA Passports to Learning. Successful completion of the challenges will be endorsed by the school's CUA coordinator.
