The students really have enjoyed the lessons and despite the travel to Owen and the uncertainty that they faced initially due to the depth of the pool, they have all really enjoyed it. Rm 14 and Ber 3 have extended an invitation to the parents of their students to watch the lesson at 9:30am tomorrow. The Year 4-7 Swimming Carnival will begin at 11am. This year, the carnival has been significantly modified due to travel restrictions and being limited to one pool. We are sure the students who are involved will have a fantastic day. Format

This year the carnival will consist of Championship events only. There will be no class games.

Each year level (year 4-7) will have the opportunity to compete in either a lap (25m) or width (10m) race in the championships events: freestyle, breaststroke (25m only) or backstroke. Students have been tested during lesson times and will only be able to compete in a length race if they were passed for this by the instructor.

Students will only be able to compete in their age group in the championship events.

We will not be using lane ropes and will have up to 6 students in a race. The number of students in each race will be determined by the number of competitors and decided by the Chief Marshall. Students will be able to start from a diving position, or in the pool. Guidelines for the championship and relay events will be explained to the students at school on Friday morning.

Please see the program for events. Note that this year, all 25m championship races will take place prior to the 10m races.

Attendance at School

Students will attend school lessons as normal on Friday morning. Students will be given an early recess (9:50am) and then will play prior to catching the bus from BPS to Owen. We anticipate that the students will arrive at Owen Swimming Pool at approximately 10:50am.

Students who have attended school and are travelling to Owen via car will need to be signed out. An SSO will have sign out sheets outside of the Front Office from 10:15am - 10:25am on Friday morning. Once students arrive at the pool,

they will need to be signed back in.

We would prefer students to come to school with their bathers under their school clothes and wearing closed-in school appropriate shoes. Things can be packed in the swimming bag. Students must remember to bring dry underwear so that they can change before leaving school Friday afternoon.

Students that are remaining at school will be supervised by teaching staff and will undertake learning activities.

Students who do not attend school on Friday morning will need to follow normal absence procedures and will need to be signed in upon arrival at the Owen Swimming Pool. Normal absence procedures apply for students who are not attending school or the carnival on Friday.

Students / Spectators / Sign Out:

School students are the responsibility of the school staff and must remain in their house shaded area throughout the carnival. Students will not be allowed to sit with parents. If you wish to take your child home from the carnival, please speak with a teacher and sign them out just prior to leaving the pool. Please do not sign a child out so that they can sit with you in the parent spectator area.

We encourage all students and families to stay for the entire carnival. Please do not sign your child out to leave early if they have committed to competing in a relay. It makes it extremely difficult when students leave early as we need to find new competitors at the last minute to take their place.

Canteen facilities / What to bring:

The Canteen will not be available at the Owen Swimming Pool and lunch orders will not be available from the BHS canteen for students who are in Year 4-7 and attending the carnival. All students and adults attending the carnival will need to bring a packed lunch / food supplies and water bottle.

We also suggest that parents bring chairs.

Photographs:

Please ensure you are only taking photographs of your own children and do not place photos of other students on social media.

Non School age attenders:

If siblings are attending the carnival, they are the responsibility of parents. No children will be allowed in any of the pools unless they are competing in a championship event. This includes the toddler pool.

Sun Smart expectations:

Students will be expected to follow sun smart requirements and are encouraged to bring their own sunscreen. Rashies / T-shirts can only be removed for a championship events.

House Teams:

New students to BPS have been notified of their house team. **Brightwood, Cameron, Dalkey** or **Preston**. Students are encouraged to dress in their house colours and good sportsmanship and encouragement of team mates will be expected. Students who are not following BPS expectations will need to be collected by a parent / caregiver and taken home. Looking forward to another great (although modified) BPS Swimming Carnival.

2021 Swimming Lessons







Our students have the opportunity to be involved in an exciting program: 'Children's University Australasia and Africa (IO)'. Children's University (CU) aims to encourage high quality out of school activities for children aged between 5 and 14 years, engaging the wider community as learning partners in this process. The most important principles of CU are that participation is voluntary and activities must take place outside the normal school day during lunch, after school, weekends and holidays.



Led by the University of Adelaide, CU aims to nurture aspirations and develop a love of learning. Children and young people enrolled in CU are issued with a 'Passport to Learning' which records their individual learning journey. After the first 30 hours of learning, children are rewarded for their participation at a graduation ceremony held at the University of Adelaide or a prestigious venue in regional areas. Children can graduate multiple times depending on the hours they accrue. Information on the hours, and award levels, can be found in the 'Passport to Learning'.

Participating students have access to activities at school, online and also in the wider community (Learning Destinations). These activities have been validated by CU trained staff as good learning experiences. Once your child becomes a member, a full list of Learning Destinations

can be found at www.cuaustralasia.com by logging on to the Learning Portal*.

CU members are also able to earn 10 hours from Regular Restricted Activities. These are external organisations where students are paying members and attend regularly (e.g. sporting clubs, dance studios, swimming centres etc.). In order to earn hours, students who participate in these activities complete a 'Review' form either in the CU portal or in hard copy issued by the CU school coordinator.

Please note that CU is not compulsory, children are encouraged to take responsibility for their learning, choosing what to do from a variety of offerings. All CU learning is designed to inspire children to think about their futures with a greater knowledge of the careers and professions that they could aspire to.

Students are enrolled in CU when they receive their Passport to Learning. The annual fee for 2021 is \$16.50 (inc. GST), which includes a passport (if required). Any replacement passports will incur a fee of \$5.50 (inc GST).

If your child would like to become a member of CU for 2021 membership forms are available from the Balaklava Primary front office. Please complete the paperwork and send the payment to the school by Monday 1st March.

For Friday the 19th of March we will be putting a program together for the National Ride2School Day. VICTOR HARBOR CAMP:


