Our Learning SA

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, your child might need to learn at home. The Department for Education have used teachers who work in Central Office to create a suite of year level and Australian Curriculum appropriate lessons to support short-term learning when face to face learning is interrupted.

There are 11 weeks of lessons for reception to year 2 students, and 5 weeks of lessons for year 3 to 10 students. Students can start from Week 1, lesson 1 and work their way through the lessons in order. Each lesson is either a video or PowerPoint presentation and can be completed on any device with internet access. I used one of the Civics and Citizenship and PE lessons in class this week and found them fantastic and easy to use.

SAPSASA District Softball

Selection / Practice dates for the Mid North District Softball Team will be held on:

- Wednesday 23rd March
- Wednesday 30th March
- Wednesday 6th April

From 4.00pm – 5.30pm at Auburn Primary School Oval.

All Year 6 or Year 5 girls wishing to try out for the District team will need to attend practices on these dates.

The District team will play in Adelaide at the Softball State Carnival in Week 11 Term 1 from Monday 11th April to Wednesday 13th April 2022.

All girls trying out need to know that if they are selected in the District team, they will need to find their own accommodation in Adelaide (and get to and from the grounds every day at West Beach opposite West Beach Caravan Park) either by staying with a relative/friend, staying at the Caravan Park or travelling up every day (or car-pooling) This unfortunately will preclude some girls from trying out if they are not able to make arrangements for the 3 days.

Approximate cost if selected in the team is \$100.

Please bring along a hat, drink and a glove from your school if possible.

Students will be selected for the team based on the following criteria:

- Ability and game sense in the sport
- Teamwork and effort
- Willingness to listen and learn from feedback
- Positive attitude (including at school)

Where students are equally matched, older students and even hub & school distribution is considered.

Transport: Parents/Caregivers are responsible for organising transport to and from the trials. Supervision: Students will be under the supervision of the teacher team official and other identified responsible persons (with appropriate WWCC) to ensure supervision ratios are met.

Contingency plans: If unforeseen circumstances mean the trials are unable to go ahead, families and schools will be notified as soon as possible. Trials will either be rescheduled if time permits, or an alternate venue will be organised. How to nominate – please note new process – If you have done this for Hub Team selection you won't need to complete again.

• Parents/Caregivers must nominate their child online.

• Students who have not nominated online before the trials will not be eligible to attend trials. This is to ensure supervision ratios are maintained for a safe environment.

Students in Years 4-6 have been learning about coding. Year 5-6 are revisiting Binary while Year 4/5's are beginning the exploration. To introduce them to coding whilst reinforcing a growth mindset, students were sent on an 'escape room' style adventure where each corner of the room contained a puzzle to be solved. Once answered, 6 secret numbers had to be arranged in a correct order according to a riddle which unlocked a sweet surprise at the end.

Students talked about teamwork, different types of coding, map reading, time zones, word puzzles and the importance of having a go. It was great to see and hear such determination and resilience.



There are many different ways parents and carers can help strengthen skills and abilities in children from home. Here are some ideas;

· Reading to children

 \cdot Listening to children read, ask questions about the text, and predict what might happen next

 \cdot Describe the location of an object in an illustration

· Find letters, sounds, and words in text

· Share an enjoyment of reading from others in the family

· Read books and watch the movie

Write your own book

• Read to Grandma or Grandpa over the phone or computer

 \cdot Allowing free play with objects that show repeated and growing patterns, numbers and shapes

 \cdot Playing board games, electronic games and puzzles

Sharing real stories, imaginative stories and books that have mathematical concepts, such as numbers, patterns, sharing, same or

different, odd one out and shapes



• Recording activities, such as reading and writing 0 to 10, tallying, and using language association to demonstrate and practice the reading, saying and writing number names

· Counting aloud with children as they play board games, climb steps or watch traffic

 \cdot Supporting children to anticipate the next number

• Supporting children to notice and predict the next item in a pattern when doing repetitive activities, such modelling placing a knife, fork, spoon, knife, fork, what do I need next when setting the table

• Asking children what they should put on first, second, next and last when getting dressed

 Modelling and involving children in numeracy tasks like estimating, measuring, adding, and analysing data

· Asking open-ended questions that involve real-life problems

• Allowing enough time for children to think about and respond to a question, even if they don't answer it correctly.

· Estimate the total cost of your supermarket purchase

· Estimate and weigh the fruit and vegetables

· Explore orienteering
