## NATIONAL ASSESSMENT PROGRAM Literacy and Numeracy Naplan Testing

This year the National NAPLAN tests for years for Years 3 and 5 students will commence on Monday May 9th, which is the start of Week 2.
All will be online except for the Yr 3 writing which will be pencil and paper format. It is anticipated the tests will be completed by the end of that week.

All year 3 and 5 students took part in a successful practice test on the 24th of March to make sure there would be no hiccups our end with online issues. The practice tests also familiarized the students with the format of the online platform.

There are demo tests available that many of the students have been undertaking in class at the NAPLAN site, https://www. nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site. These have allowed students to further increase their familiarity with the literacy and numeracy tests.
