

Sports Day Info

General Information

All students are encouraged to dress in their House Team colours, wear appropriate sun safe clothing, appropriate footwear and have a hat, sunscreen and plenty of water. Please contact the school if you are unaware of your Yr 3 - 6 child's House Team.

All students who participate are given points for their team.... Participation is important as is good sportsmanship.

Please be reminded, if you are taking your child home early, please inform the teacher and sign them out.

The canteen will not be open. Students may bring a packed lunch. The PCC will have cupcakes and coffee for sale on the day. A BBQ order form was sent out and has now closed.

Programs will be sent out on Skoolbag and SeeSaw and a hard copy was sent home today.

If you are taking photos and posting on Social Media, please be mindful that you are only posting photos of your children and not others.

The official opening will take place at approximately 9am. Junior Primary students may watch but will then return to their classes where they will remain in normal lessons until their scheduled early recess time. (Students to bring recess and fruit as usual) During this time, the JP students will have the opportunity to visit the cupcake stand (with their teacher) to purchase cupcakes.

The JP students will have recess then begin their health hustle followed by the rotation of activities. This will be at approximately 10:50am.

The Year 3-6 students move straight into their events after the opening, continuing through to lunch.

At approximately 12:30pm, staff will collect pre-ordered BBQ lunches. After lunch, students participate in sprints on the oval and stay for the relays and presentations. We aim to close the day between 2:45-3pm.

Please ensure you don't take your child home early if they are in a relay.

Please note: in case of inclement weather, events may be restructured, removed from the program or shortened. If the weather forecast on Monday evening indicates that it will be too wet or dangerous to run the day it will be moved to Wednesday. If we can't hold it Wednesday we will fufill lunch orders but cancel Sports Day.

Sports Day Set-up

Many hands make light work... if you are able to come along and help set up for Sports Day at 7:45am on Tuesday morning (16/08) we would greatly appreciate it. Similarly, if you can hang around at the end of the day and help pack up, we would also really appreciate it

Teachers have made contact with parents as they need two parent helpers per age group. If you are able to help and haven't already offered, please let the classroom teacher know

COVID-19 UPDATE

We need to ensure we are complying with current Health SA and DFE guidelines.

Please note that families will not be allowed to sit with classes at eating times and must sit away from the house tents. Please feel free to bring a chair to sit on the Eastern side of the running track for the sprints and relays.

All visitors to the school will need to use the BER disabled toilet and we will be cleaning this at regular intervals.

All visitors must sign in and out at the Scorers tent. Please do not attend if unwell.









Information for ALL Spectators and Volunteers



The following expectations have been put into place to ensure we are following DfE and SA Health Covid requirements. We request that you abide by them as we have worked hard to ensure we have procedures in place that allow spectators to attend Sports Day.

All Spectators / Visitors to the School (including parents, community members and non BPS siblings / children) **MUST:**

- <u>Sign in and out</u> via the Sign in sheet located at the Scorer's tent. It is essential that we have an accurate
 record of all attendees.
- Adhere to the 1.5m Social Distancing rule at all times. This includes when lining up for pre-ordered lunch, coffee and cupcakes and watching events etc. Pre-ordered lunch for non-school student spectators, cupcakes, drinks and coffee will be located outside of the OSU – North of the Bus Road
- Students will stay in their class group when eating. Parents / non school children will need to be seated away from groups of school students.
- JP students are given the opportunity to purchase cupcakes throughout the morning (prior to the start of their sports day). Please feel free to send your child with money for a cupcake and a staff member will assist them.
- The volunteers who will be serving the food, will serve all condiments. You must not help yourself.
- Use the Disabled toilet located in the BER building. This is a single toilet. At times, there may be a line up so
 please be patient. Alternatively, there are public toilets available in Apex Park (near the Skate Park) Visitors
 are not to use the other toilets located onsite as these are dedicated staff and student toilets.
- Covid hygiene must be practiced regularly throughout the day. It would be appreciated if you could bring your own Sanitiser please.
- The water bubblers can only be used for refilling water bottles. Students and families need to bring their own water.
- The playgrounds and equipment must not be used by any non-school children at all throughout the day. If younger siblings are attending Sports Day and are restless, we suggest you take them to Apex Park to play on the fantastic public playground.
- Spectators and volunteers will need to stay on the Eastern (Wallace Street) side of the oval to watch the sprints and relays. Please feel free to BYO chair and / or picnic rug. Only School students and staff are to be sitting near the House Team shades.
- If students are leaving early, a parent must speak with the teacher first and then the student must be signed out. The sign out sheets for all students will be located near the Scorers tent. First Aid will also be located in the Scorer's tent. Please don't take your child home before they have finished all of their events. It adds some extra pressure to Sports Captains if students are in relay teams but leave prior to the race.

We are looking forward to a great day, encouraging Participation, Encouragement and Good Sportsmanship from competitors and spectators.

Positive Play:

We introduced the positive behaviour strategy of Positive Play



in 2020. The criteria for receiving Positive Play is ensuring that students return to class on time after each break and they don't leave a learning area without permission. Students who have been successful in these two areas, receive 15 minutes of free play on Friday. Students who do not receive Positive Play, spend that time speaking with their teacher about which expectations they did not meet and why that was the case. They then work on strategies to avoid the same situation the following week.

The introduction of this strategy resulted in a significant decrease in students in the yard during learning times. It is now time to increase the expectations for receiving Positive Play. As of next week, in order for students to receive Positive Play they will need to:

- Return to class promptly after breaks (they have a three minute music warning and then a siren to indicate the cut off time in which to return to class)
- Only leave the class when they have permission from the teacher
- Wear correct School Uniform eq.
- School Hats must not be written on, cut or ripped
- Hoodies are not to be worn under Polos
- Long sleeve shirts in a colour other than Black are not to be worn under Polos
- Clothing should not show large visible logos

Please see list to the left which indicates other uniform requirements.

We do understand that sometimes, students may not have a school jumper. In this case, they are allowed to wear their casual jumper but once they arrive at school, they need to attend the front office where we will exchange their jumper for a school jumper for the day. Students may also wear a cap / non- school uniform beanie to school, however, once they arrive at school, they will need to remove any non-uniform items.

ROAD SAFETY



On Friday, 29th July (Week 1), David the traffic policeman came to our school to talk about road safety. This is what we learnt:

- Črossing the road-when you see a car coming you have to stop and wait till the car goes passed. Then look right, then left, then right again until it is safe to cross.
- At a round-a-bout and you see a car coming, stop and wait until the car has passed and it is safe to go.
- You must wear a seat belt in any vehicle to stay safe.

David also bought along his teddy which was a german shepherd dog called, Jeffrey. They both tour around SA, visiting lots of schools.

We learnt that you should wear bright colours to make sure the public is aware that you are there.

There are many different types of school crossings. At BPS we have an Emu crossing. Across the road, at Horizon they have a Koala crossing. When you are at any Emu crossing you must stop and walk your bike over the road when the sign is up. When it is down, you have to stop and wait.

ROAD SAFETY

On Friday the 29th July David from the Road Safety Centre near the Thebarton Police Barracks, spoke with all year 4 - 6 students. He explained the road rules and the things that they can and cannot do on their bikes and scooters. It was certainly an eye opener for the students and staff with the range of things that you cannot do while riding a bike.

Officer David also stressed how important it was to download the **EMERGENCY PLUS** app to their phones and encourage families and friends to put the app on their phones. Emergency services can be called directly from this app by pushing one of the images on screen and pressing OK.

This was some feedback from the students....

Claudia - The Police officer spoke to the students regarding the road rules and how important it was to wear a helmet and ride 1.5 meters apart.

Joe - He demonstrated the appropriate hand signals to use when we ride our bikes.

Emilee – He stressed that it was very important to wear bright / light colours so that the traffic can see you.

Caitlyn - He showed us all the different types of crossings and how to use each one safely.

Ty - He showed us videos on how to safely ride out bikes on the road with traffic passing.

Casey - It is illegal to ride and electric scooter on the road or footpath without a licence

Brooke – it is also illegal to ride a hoverboard on the road while using a licence.

Noah – you cannot use your phone or eat while riding your bike on the road and you cannot lead a dog off your bike too.

We Are Learning To (WALT) =

Over the last two weeks I have sent out what we will be learning to do in arts and technology. I am often told by parents that they wish to know what their child is doing and what their expectations are and so this semester I decided to make a take home sheet.

To answer the common student question "but why?" I put in a section that explained why this is in the curriculum, how it helps their development and how it relates to real-world situations.

I asked the students to have the conversation with their family within the first three weeks, to encourage discussion, insight and show how they interpreted the read-through (and for those who might forget it in their bag!). I requested that they get a signature from their caregiver after they had spoken about it with them so that students wouldn't forget about it.

2022 Focus is Literacy

Staff have been busy attending training sessions over the last year to learn more about Literacy, Spelling and Reading in particular. We have been reading a book called Spelling for Life by Lyn Stone and she has listed a few 'spelling for life quick rules.' There are many spelling rules, we will list a few in each newsletter during the term. It will be interesting to see if you have heard of these rules before. We will also share some definitions of terms you may not have heard before.

You may notice the more technical terms being used in classrooms and your children may come home using this language. The way we deliver spelling has slightly changed due to the training we have been doing, the foundation work of grammar and spelling rules have always been taught and will continue to be.

We will continue to work in adding this information and some new activities to our school website as the term progresses.

Week 3

Spelling for Life Quick Rules List

- When a vowel is at the end of a syllable, it may say its name.
- When you cannot use <e>, or <i>, use <y>.
- Final Silent E can make a vowel say its name, even if it has to jump over a consonant to do it.
- Final Silent E can make a <c> say /s/ and <g> say /j/.
- Final Silent E stops the word from ending with illegal Letters.
- Final Silent E can give the last syllable a vowel.

Glossary

- Prefix A letter or letters added before a base to form a new, related word.
- Root The earliest known origin of a word.
- Suffix A letter or letters added after a base to form a new, related word.
- Base The simplest possible meaningful word-unit with no prefixes or suffixes; e.g., the removal of the prefix and suffix from the word 'unclearly' leaves the base 'clear'. This cannot be reduced any further.








Dear Families.

Preschool is such a year of rapid growth for children-full of challenges like separating from parents and families; learning with other children; forming new relationships with educators and blossoming over the 4 terms as their growing independence emerges.

In addition to starting Kindy at the beginning of the year, in 2023 we see the introduction of a mid-year intake into preschool. Children who turn 4 years old before 1 May can continue to start preschool at the beginning of the year. Children who turn 4 years old from 1 May to 31 October can commence preschool at the start of term 3. All preschool children will receive 600 hours of preschool across 4 terms. Children starting preschool in the 2023 mid-year intake, will complete terms 3 and 4 plus terms 1 and 2 of the following year. They will then start school in term 3, 2024 in the mid-year intake. A mid-year intake will start in schools for term 3, 2024. Students who start school through a mid-year intake complete 6 terms of reception.
