## 2022 Focus is Literacy

Staff have been busy attending training sessions over the last year to leam more about Literacy, Spelling and Reading in particular. We have been reading a book called Spelling for Life by Lyn Stone and she has listed a few 'spelling for life quick rules.' There are many spelling rules, we will list a few in each newsletter during the term. It will be interesting to see if you have heard of these rules before. We will also share some definitions of terms you may not have heard before.

You may notice the more technic al termsbeing used in cla ssroomsand yourchildren may come home using this language. The way we deliver spelling has slightly changed due to the training we have been doing, the foundation work of grammar and spelling rules ha ve always been taught a nd will continue to be.

We will continue to work in adding this information and some new activities to our school website as the term progresses.

## Week 5

## Spelling for Life Quick Rules List

- A consonant plus-ie cannot be split at the end of a word.
- Final Silent E can stop words looking like plurals.
- When you add a vowel suffix to a Final Silent E word, drop the Final Silent E.
- When a vowel comes before $<>$ it goes wacky.
- $\langle e\rangle,\langle a\rangle,\langle \rangle$ inside a word often makesa Wicked Sister sound.


## Glossary

- Phoneme - The smallest possible unit of sound. The word 'pat' has three phonemes, in that it can be broken into three separate units. The word 'path' also has three phonemes, the units/p-a-th/.
- Phonemic awareness - The ability to perceive the number, order, sameness, and difference of sounds within words.
- Phonology - The study of the sound system of a language and the relationships within.
