COVID-19 UPDATE

Please see page 17 for an update of the testing, isolation and quarantine requirements for School Settings. From 14th October, isolation and quarantine will not be required, but it is strongly recommended that all staff and students do not attend sites for 5 days after being identified as COVID-19 positive.

Please continue to inform us if your child tests positive for Covid-19 as I need to report this information to the department.

Please remember that symptomatic staff, students and visitors should not be attending schools. If your child does develop symptoms of illness throughout the day, we will contact parents and ask for the student to be collected as soon as possible.

For illnesses other than Covid, we ask that all students stay away from school for a minimum of 24 hours (strongly recommend 48 hours) after their last symptom.

COVID safe measures for meetings and events:

Schools, must make sure that the following COVID safe measures are in place for meetings and events:

- recommended physical distancing requirements can be met by all attending adults
- masks are strongly recommended (but not required) for all adults
- appropriate hygiene provisions are in place, for example sanitiser stations
- attendees are advised that they must not attend if unwell, even mildly.

Classes:

It is that time of the school year that staff are thinking forward to 2023. It is extremely important that we know your intentions for 2023 in order to have class numbers as accurate as possible. If you know of anyone moving into the area, please encourage them to book a time to meet with myself. Please send me an email, text or give me a ring if your children will not be attending Balaklava Primary next year. We appreciate your support in helping to make this process as streamlined as possible.

Placements:

The class placement process will begin as soon as we have the structures in place. This process is completed over a number of weeks and staff work hard to ensure we place students carefully in regards to class size and structure. We also try to ensure we put together groups of students who will work and learn well together.

To do this we consider:

- The learning needs of each child
- A good balance of boys and girls
- Learning abilities
- Each child's friendship needs

Teachers will give strong consideration to each child's friendship needs. If friends do not work well together, teachers may decide not to put them into the same class. School is a time to learn to develop new friendships. A new class and a new school year is an ideal time to make new friends.

A few children have very special learning or health needs. If you believe that your child has such needs, we will strive to do our very best to take this into consideration when we finalise classes, but due to a range of complexities, this may not always be possible.

While we welcome letters regarding other parental considerations, we must stress that requests will be considered but are not always possible. We do ask that you do not request specific teachers as staffing for 2023 has not been confirmed.

Feedback from the parent survey suggested families would like suggestions on how to help their children with their education. Here are a few ideas to support your children.

Junior Primary

- Listen to my child read daily.
- Read to my child daily.
- Talk to children and build their vocabulary, teach your child a new word and what it means each day.
- · Count objects and write numbers.
- Add numbers together, or complete simple subtraction sums.
- Play games with children like snap or memory.
- Talk to children about where you travel, how far it is, how long it takes to get there.

Middle/Upper Primary

- Read to my child.
- Listen to my child read, encourage independent reading.
- Question my child on what they are reading, discuss the feelings of characters, ask
 questions about the actions of characters, predict what might happen next, rewrite
 the ending of a book.
- Discuss travel how far, how long will it take, look at the location on a map.
- Play board games eg. Monopoly, Uno, Skipbo.
- Talk to your child to build their vocabulary; explain new words, how to spell them, where they come from and how to say them correctly.
- Get children to help around the home; cooking, washing dishes, sweeping the floor, gardening etc.

Way 2 Go - BIKE EDUCATION





From the 23rd to 30th September all of our Year 5 and 6 students participated in the Way2Go, Bike Education program. Way2Go is a statewide South Australian program promoting safer, greener and more active travel for primary school students and their communities. Students practiced their skills on school grounds for the first three lessons and then took their learning onto the streets to implement such skills in a real life setting.

It was great to see our students learning about the road rules, putting on a helmet safely, checking their brakes and making sure that their bicycles were roadworthy and safe to ride.

The instructors enjoyed staying in Balaklava and working with all our students and staff. We hope to see them back in 2024 to work with our future Year 5 and 6 students.



We did three days of practicing in school before we got to go out of school on the road. What we had to do to go out on the road was to be able to know all the road signs and to make sure we knew all the road rules like practicing how to signal left and right and how to go around a roundabout. On day four in the morning we had to make sure we were allowed to go out on the road so we checked with the Bike Ed person and she would check our name and would see if we passed to go out on the road. On day

five and six we got to go out and ride on the roads, we had to do our bike and helmet check and then got split up into groups of four. When we were in our groups we got to head off. On the first day of riding on the road we did six kilometres and on the second day we had the same groups and we went riding on the lions trail which was super fun. On the last day we rode another six kilometres. - Halle Y

My favourite part of Bike Ed was going out of school and learning things, such as going around the roundabouts. It was also fun when they had set up all the cones and drew with chalk on the basketball court at school where we had to practice to give way and stop at a pedestrian crossing and all the other things you have to do on the roads. – Ilka G

We would like to say a big thank you to everyone who participated in our Parent/Caregiver survey regarding our Social/Emotional Program to be implemented in 2023. Thirty-one of our families responded, sharing valuable feedback on how we can continue to enhance our school wellbeing curriculum for every child who attends Balaklava Primary School.

As research shows educators and school communities play a significant role in supporting and developing learner wellbeing. We also know that students wellbeing is crucial to academic achievement, and wellbeing programs can support and accelerate students' learning.

The survey showed families would like a program that instills confidence, resilience and helps their child with organisational skills to help prepare them for their future years of schooling and beyond. There was overwhelming support to introduce a Social/Emotional program at school that would complement the values being taught at home.

All results of the survey will be anonymously collated and analysed by staff, the Wellbeing Team and Leadership in the upcoming weeks to help us implement a program suited to our students and families needs. As we know choosing the right wellbeing program and measuring its impact and effectiveness are important components of a whole-school community approach to wellbeing.

Once again, we are extremely grateful to all our families that contributed their valuable time, honest information, and thoughtful suggestions.

2023 Proposed Materials & Services Charge

Dear Parent / Caregiver

Opposite is information regarding the fee structure for students at Balaklava Primary School.

The procedures for School Charges for 2023 remain as they have for the past few years. Attached to this letter is a copy of the water-marked 2023 Material and Service Charge notice which has been approved by Department for Education.

We will be presenting this document to Governing Council on **Tuesday 1st November** for approval. Should parents have any objection to the costs listed or wish to have any discussion about the charges, they are very welcome to attend this meeting which will be held in the Staffroom at the school at 7.00pm. If you are unable to attend the meeting, you are very welcome to forward in writing to the Principal or the Governing Council Chairperson, any comments pertaining to the charges.

If the charges are approved at this meeting, the 2023 M&S Charge for Balaklava Primary School will be \$280.00 per student. Fees for 2021 were \$265.00 and 2022 are \$275.

Invoices will be posted early in January for all students.

To enable parents to pay for the M&S Charge prior to the commencement of the school year, the office will be open in the week prior to the commencement of the student year on dates yet to be confirmed. All credit cards are accepted along with cash and cheques for payment of the fees. EFTPOS facilities are available. Fees are payable using our QKR app for mobile phones also.

For those who are eligible for School Card, procedures have remained the same as last year i.e., both parents whose names appear on cards need to sign the form. Income limits and eligibility are based on the 2021/2022 financial year. The eligibility criterion for the 2023 School Card Scheme is based on whether the applicant's combined family gross income is within the School Card income limits. Eligibility is not dependent on any member of the family receiving any Centrelink benefits or Family Tax benefits. There are many different application forms for School Card. All forms will be available in January from the online portal at:

The newly relaid paving and replaced ramp outside of Room 1 and 2 looks fantastic.














The sink and bubbler area outside of Science has been cleaned up and the pipes etc enclosed.
