COVID-19 UPDATE



Covid update

Please ensure you contact us as soon as possible if your child tests positive to Covid. There are notification requirements for the Department as well as requirements regarding notifying staff and families.

We do have a Covid Positive Notification form available on Skoolbag for families to provide us with the information we require.

We will send out a daily notification if we have a positive case at school or on the school bus. This notification will go to all families and will be sent out via Skoolbag.

Please be reminded that if students are unwell, they must not attend school.

Staff at School will likely start to wear masks. We strongly recommend that visitors entering buildings or who are unable to social distance, also wear masks.

Illness

It is extremely important that we minimise the spread of illness.

The best way to stop the spread is to ensure that your child does not attend school when unwell.



Students must stay home for **24 hours** after their last symptom, however, to ensure you child is completely recovered, we do strongly encourage you to keep your child home for **48 hours** after their last symptom. It takes everyone doing the right thing to ensure we can limit the impact for all students and staff.

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Classes:

It is that time of the school year that staff are thinking forward to 2023. It is extremely important that we know your intentions for 2023 in order to have class numbers as accurate as possible. If you know of anyone moving into the area, please encourage them to book a time to meet with myself. Please send me an email, text or give me a ring if your children will not be attending Balaklava Primary next year. We appreciate your support in helping to make this process as streamlined as possible.

Placements:

The class placement process will begin as soon as we have the structures in place. This process is completed over a number of weeks and staff work hard to ensure we place students carefully in regards to class size and structure. We also try to ensure we put together groups of students who will work and learn well together.

To do this we consider:

- The learning needs of each child
- A good balance of boys and girls
- Learning abilities
- Each child's friendship needs

Teachers will give strong consideration to each child's friendship needs. If friends do not work well together, teachers may decide not to put them into the same class. School is a time to learn to develop new friendships. A new class and a new school year is an ideal time to make new friends.

A few children have very special learning or health needs. If you believe that your child has such needs, we will strive to do our very best to take this into consideration when we finalise classes, but due to a range of complexities, this may not always be possible.

While we welcome letters regarding other parental considerations, we must stress that requests will be considered but are not always possible. We do ask that you do not request specific teachers as staffing for 2023 has not been confirmed.

Please ensure all requests are forwarded in writing via a letter addressed to myself or emailed to <u>dl.0477.info@schools.sa.edu.au</u> Letters of request need to be sent through by no later than **Friday November 4th**.







We look forward to seeing how tall our plants will grow in the upcoming weeks.




SAPSASA BASKETBALL - ADELAIDE

Restorative Practices Workshop



with Kerrie Sellen





In the well, most of the Year 5s had a lesson with Kerrie Sellen. We talked about feeling spiky and opening up. We listened to this story on the whiteboard. The main character was a girl called Mary. A quick version of the story: Mary found \$200 on the street but she was hiding it from her Mum then she put it in her draw. Then later that day Mr Murray told Mum that he lost \$200 for the family holiday. Then mum went into Mary's draw to get a pencil but she found the \$200. Then Mary and her family were feeling spiky. Mary's family sorted things out. Then Mary fell open and happy about the situation - **Chase M**



We learnt that feeling angry or frustrated is ok but not both at the same time. People also don't need to remind you because, sometimes you know what you did wrong. But don't get angry on purpose because it can cause a fight between you and another person. But if you realise what you did and apologise for it, it won't cause a fight. Sometimes there are voices in your head that tell you to do something bad but you know it's the wrong thing. When Mary (in the story) didn't tell her mum she felt guilty for keeping the \$200 off the ground. 

Here is a copy of the phonics and spelling scope and sequence that BPS use. You will notice there is an order to the way we teach sounds, starting with set 1 and the letters s, a, t, p, i, m. You will also find that when children learn these letters they read decodable readers that use the same letters from set 1. Research shows us that this is the best practise for students to learn. The students continue to follow the sequence listed above and they will continue to read decodable readers following the same letter pattern. Over the next few newsletters you will see more of the scope and sequence.

As students get older they will undergo the grapheme audit generally from year 2 onwards. This is an audit that will define what grapheme knowledge students are missing from the scope and sequence. We can then specifically target those gaps to support students spelling skills.

Remember there are supporting videos you can watch at home to support children's learning. Go to https://www.education.sa.gov.au/our-learning-sa and click on primary years learning at home, select a year level, literacy, choose a lesson. Staff will be busy during the term re-testing students learning to see how much they have grown throughout the year with our new approach to our synthetic phonics system of literacy learning. Does your child become very afraid of certain situations or objects, worry about a lot of things, get very distressed, or try to avoid things they fear?

About the study

Our team at Griffith University may be able to assist you. We are conducting a nationwide study that includes the following services at no cost to families: A thorough assessment of your child's anxiety with

- a trained psychologist via the telephone; Your child receiving one of two kinds of homebased treatments delivered on a PC, laptop or
- Two follow-up telephone assessments with a trained psychologist 6- and 12-months after treatment to track your child's progress.

The study aims to find out if these two treatments are as effective as each other, and which children have the best response to each kind of treatment. This will mean that there are more evidence-based treatments available for helping anxious children.
