Ruby has consistently kept up to date with all work and her bookwork is always neat and well presented.









Dear Parents/Caregivers

The Balaklava Schools Canteen offers a wide range of delicious, healthy food for our students with the emphasis on *good food choices*. The canteen accepts lunch orders from both schools with high school students being able to buy over the counter food, drinks and ice creams during recess and lunch.

The canteen is run by our Canteen Manager, Lisa Watson along with our Canteen Assistants, Raeleen Cavanagh and Katie Urwin, who are supported by our wonderful volunteers. There are many different tasks a volunteer may carry out including baking banana bread, preparing fruit salad tubs, making different rolls and sandwiches, serving students or bagging lunch orders. We welcome parents and caregivers to volunteer in our canteen, even it is for only an hour or two, one day a term. Volunteering offers an opportunity for parents/caregivers to meet many of the children and to interact with other members of the community as you work together, gaining and building skills in the hospitality industry.

All volunteers are provided with lunch on the day along with a "bottomless cup" of tea and coffee.

We ask our valued volunteers to obtain a Working with Children Check, undergo the Responding to Abuse and Neglect training and be familiar with our induction process, which we will guide you through every step of the way. There are no out of pocket expense to you as all costs are paid by the Canteen.

If you feel you can help, please fill in the tear off slip which also includes time options. As little as an hour makes a big difference and you don't have to serve the students if you find this difficult. We thank you most sincerely for your consideration of this very valuable contribution to your child's school.

Unfortunately, with WHS being a high priority for the Canteen, we unfortunately cannot have children in the Canteen whilst parents are volunteering. We realise that this may preclude some parents from volunteering, but we are mindful of the safety of both the child and the wellbeing of the parents.
