Covid Positive Notification

Please continue to inform us **ASAP** if your child has tested positive to COVID-19, even if they haven't been at school during their infectious period. An Eform be found on Audiri (formally Skoolbag) which can be used to notify us. The Department for Education has the following directive regarding COVID-19.

- If your child develops COVID-19 symptoms, they should get tested and stay at home until they are well.
- If your child tests positive, you must inform the school immediately.
- Please keep positive COVID-19 cases at home for 5 days until acute symptoms have cleared and take steps to protect others. Siblings of confirmed positive cases are considered a close contact and should follow the advice from SA Health.
- People who have recovered from COVID-19 will not be considered a close contact for 28 days after testing positive.
- The safety and wellbeing of our students and staff is paramount. As such, we will continue to work closely with SA Health to ensure that all necessary health advice is closely followed, and all necessary precautions are taken to minimise the risk of further transmission within our community.

We will continue to provide regular updates of positive COVID-19 cases in our school.



Illness

It is the time of year that colds, flu and bug such as gastro do the rounds. It is extremely important that we minimise



the spread of any of these illnesses. The best way to stop the spread is to ensure that your child does not attend school when unwell. Students must stay home for 24 hours after their last symptom, however, to ensure you child is completely recovered, we do strongly encourage you to keep your child home for 48 hours after their last symptom. It takes everyone doing the right thing to ensure we can limit the impact for all students and staff.

OSU Air-Conditioning

Many of you will be aware that our Open Space Unit reverse cycle Air-conditioning has not been working effectively for a very long time. During the holidays, Department funded work began on the replacement of the Air-conditioning system including the new fresh air ventilation requirements brought about by COVID. We have now had individual units installed in all teaching and learning spaces. It had its first run yesterday afternoon and while not complete just yet, we can certainly see the completion approaching. Assemblies should be much more comfortable for all. We are all very excited about this long overdue replacement. Thank you to Diane for her ongoing work behind the scenes. Diane has been pushing this project for at least 8 vears.



First Nations

Hello to our First Nations families,

National Reconciliation Week 2023 begins on 27th May with "Sorry Day" and continues until 3rd June, which is Mabo Day.





I discuss Reconciliation and the various concepts related to this, with the First nations students throughout the year.

We will focus our learning in Week 4 upon "Sorry Day" and why it is so important for Australians to recognize the impact of European colonization upon our First Nations people, their land, their languages and their culture.

In Week 5 we will learn about Eddie Mabo who was the Torres Strait Islander elder who led the efforts to reform the rights for all Indigenous Australians. Mabo Day is an official holiday in the Torres Strait Islands and celebrates their unique connection to the land and the legal claims that led to the Australian Parliament passing the Native Title Act in 1993.

National Reconciliation Week always concludes with Mabo Day, which is the 3rd of June every year.

The Aboriginal Education Teacher at Balaklava High School is Mr Josh Jenner. He has organized a special National Reconciliation Week event to be held on Thursday 1st June at the BHS grounds and has invited participation by BPS students and First Nations families. The event commences at 9am with a Whole School Assembly. Then at 9:40am all students, staff and visitors will congregate on the BHS Oval area. An outline of the Aboriginal flag will be drawn on the oval and students are encouraged to stand in the areas to create a "Human flag" which will be photographed from above by a Drone. Josh Jenner has requested that students wear T-shirts in the Aboriginal flag colours – Red/Black/Yellow on the day, for this part of the event. Morning tea will be provided for First Nations families and visitors after the flag activity. More information can be found on page 9.

Unfortunately I cannot attend this Reconciliation Week event due to other teaching commitments. However, I am sure it will be an excellent opportunity for our BPS and BHS communities to celebrate and recognize the importance of reconciliation in our Australian and Torres Strait society today.

We encourage you to read with or to your child/ren on a daily basis.


