


Combined Student Free Day



Kirrilie has worked as a clinical child and adolescent psychologist for the last 25 years in private, government, and community settings. Kirrille is now the director of Developing Minds, a group of 25 child and adolescent psychologists, has provided therapy to approximately 5000 children, teens, and families, and supervised over 60 child and adolescent psychologists. She is also a lecturer and course co-ordinator at the University of South Australia, authored 3 books about young people, and provides consultation to national media, education, and health organisations.
