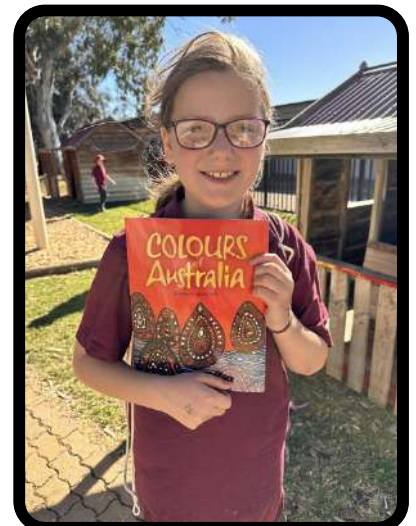
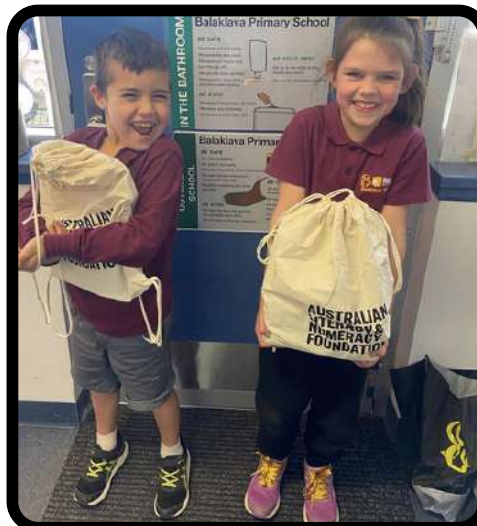

Indigenous Literacy Day

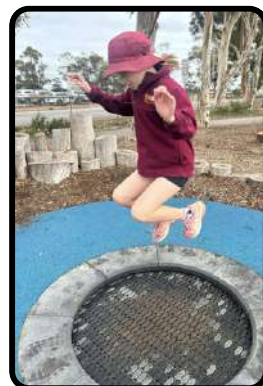
Celebrating stories and language

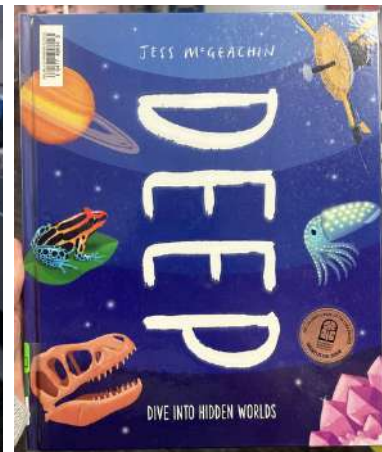
Today Mrs Cleary talked about the Non-Fiction stories - Wild Australian Life, The Deep and Runt.

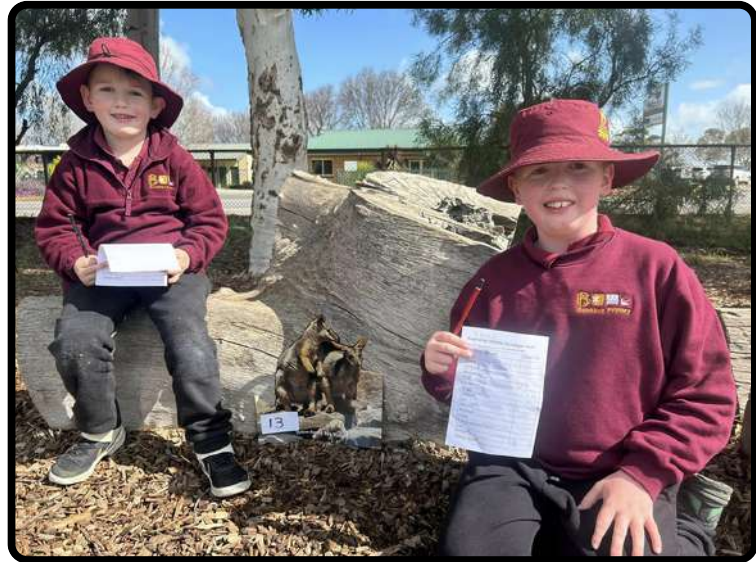
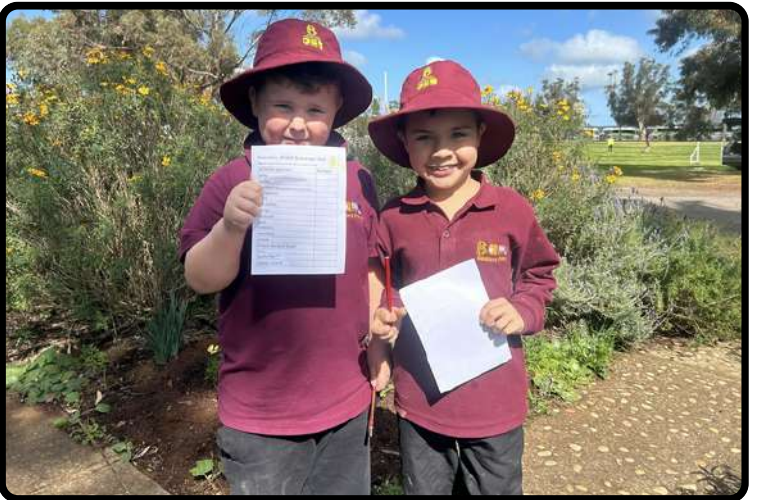
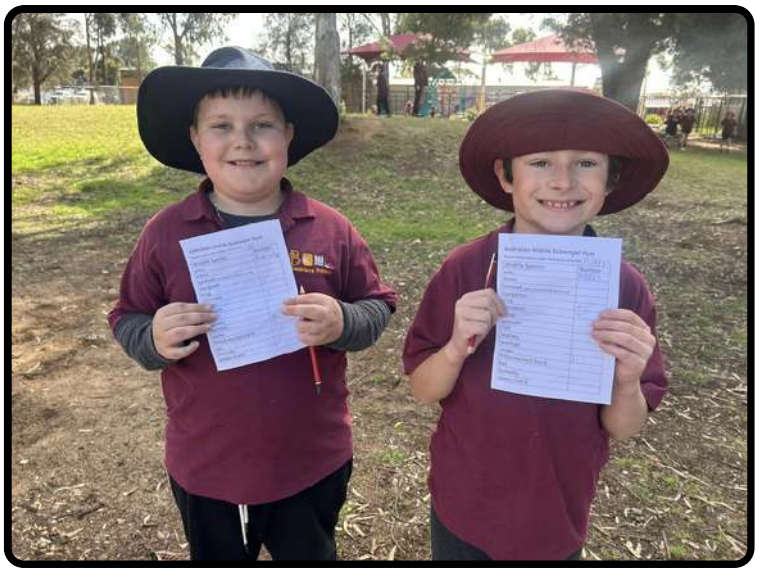

It was another epic day celebrating books. Thank you to Mrs Cleary and our VIP guest Jay









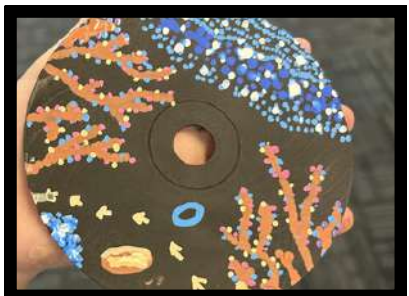

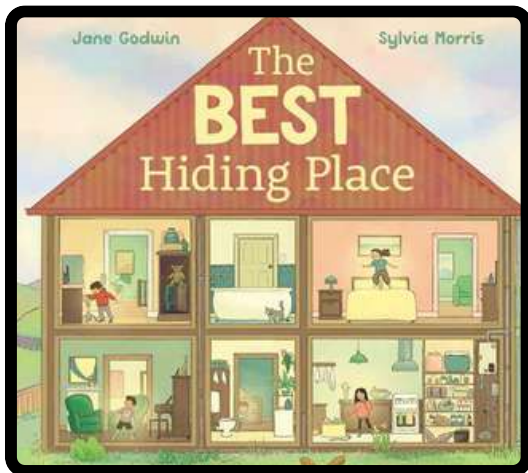
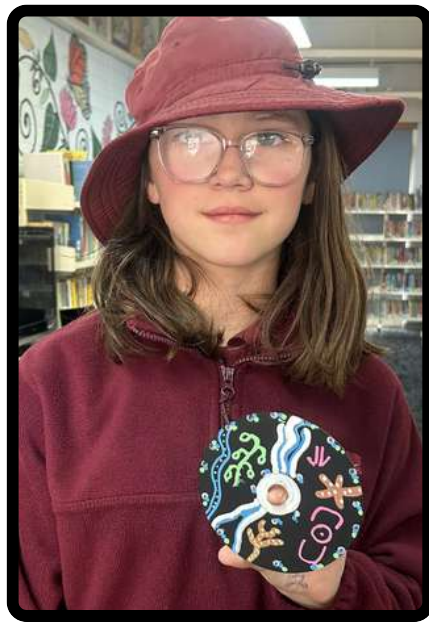
Book Week - Day 3

resilience

Resilience is important for a child's mental health. It is their ability to bounce back from failure, challenges, adversity and stress. It's not something that our students have or don't have but a skill that students develop over time as they grow. Building resilience not only helps a child deal with difficulties that arise, but it also helps develop a resilient mindset that will help them deal with challenges later in life. All children are capable of working through challenges and coping with stress, but they require guidance and support from an adult role model/s.

The four defining attributes of students who have developed strong resilient skills:

1. Stay calm when faced with challenges and difficulties
2. Choose not to fight or withdraw when very upset
3. Calm down within a reasonable period of time
4. Bounce back to doing schoolwork or being with others.

By contrast, students who are still developing their resilience skills set:

1. Get very upset quickly when faced with challenges and difficulties.
2. Choose to fight when they are angry, down or worried, or stop doing their work and spend a lot of time alone.
3. Stay upset for a long time.
4. Are slow to bounce back to doing their schoolwork or being with others.

Students in Room 18 have been discussing their strategies that help build their resilience

'To bounce back and stay calm, I tell myself it will be ok and focus on my breathing'

'Last lesson in BOB, we wrote a mind map for strategies to help us with building resilience. Some of my ideas were to talk to someone, exercise, listen to music and use relaxation techniques.' - **Ella**

'I already have a fair bit of resilience when things go wrong. I like to read a book, play games or watch TV, these things help me focus my attention on more positive thoughts.' - **Liam**

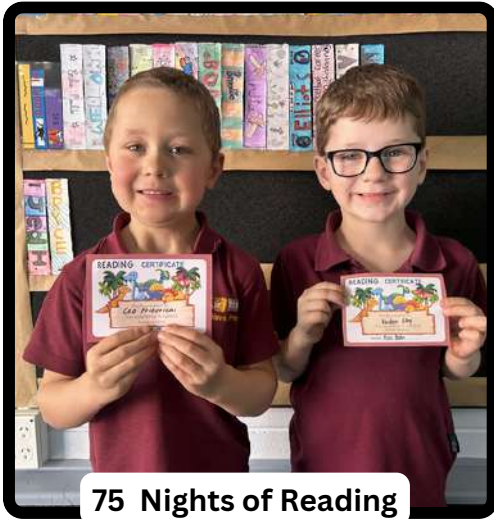

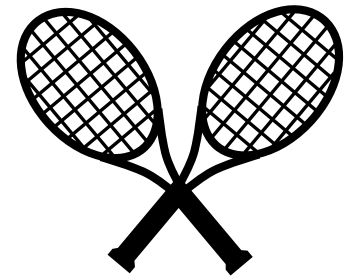
