As the term progresses, teachers are always open to parents making contact to talk about your child's learning.



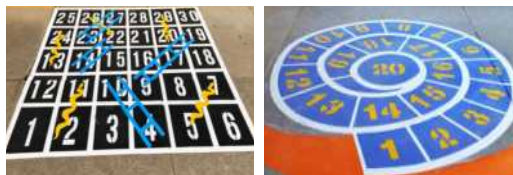
Congratulations to Rm 2 who had the most online profiles set up on Sunday evening. Rm 2 received an ice block reward. The next reward will be given next Friday for the class who has again had the most online profiles set up. Thus far Rm 2 is still in the lead with 16 profiles set up followed by Rm 6 and Ber 3 both on 13 and Ber 4 on 12. Rm 2 is also the top fundraising class to date, already having raised \$605.

Setting up an online profile does not take long and students can begin fundraising straight away. However, if you are having difficulty in setting up an online profile please contact the office for support.

We understand that not all families are able to go online and set up a profile. Therefore, it is strongly encouraged for students who won't be able to have a profile to still collect donations. We will let you know when we would like these donations to be returned to school along with prizes selected from the School Fun Run book which has been sent home today.

All fundraisers over the last 2.5 years contributed towards the inground trampolines but it was the 2021 colour run that was a significant contributor. Now that we have installed our trampolines, the students are fundraising towards line marking in the School. The package they have chosen will cost approx. \$18K which means that all fundraising efforts great or small will be a huge help in achieving this goal.

Our yard would not have any where near as many great learning opportunities if it wasn't for your support - thank you and keep up the great fundraising.

In this newsletter is a hard copy order form for white t-shirts and headbands. While students do not have to wear a white t-shirt for the colour run, it does make the colour stand out much better. If you have already or will order a T-shirt or headband via QKR, there is no need to send back the paper order form.

Classes:

It is that time of the school year that staff are thinking forward to 2024. It is extremely important that we know your intentions for 2024 in order to have class numbers as accurate as possible. If you know of anyone moving into the area, please encourage them to book a time to meet with myself. Please send me an email, text or give me a ring if your children will not be attending Balaklava Primary next year. We appreciate your support in helping to make this process as streamlined as possible.

Placements:

The class placement process will begin as soon as we have the structures in place. This process is completed over a number of weeks and staff work hard to ensure we place students carefully in regards to class size and structure. We also try to ensure we put together groups of students who will work and learn well together.

To do this we consider:

- The learning needs of each child
- A good balance of boys and girls
- Learning abilities
- Each child's friendship needs

Teachers will give strong consideration to each child's friendship needs. If friends do not work well together, teachers may decide not to put them into the same class. School is a time to learn to develop new friendships. A new class and a new school year is an ideal time to make new friends. A few children have very special learning or health needs. If you believe that your child has such needs, we will strive to do our very best to take this into consideration when we finalise classes, but due to a range of complexities, this may not always be possible.

While we welcome letters regarding other parental considerations, we must stress that requests will be considered but are not always possible. We do ask that you do not request specific teachers as staffing for 2024 has not been confirmed.

Please ensure all requests are forwarded in writing via a letter addressed to myself or emailed to dl.0477.info@schools.sa.edu.au. Letters of request need to be sent through by no later than **Friday November 3rd**.

ABORIGINAL EDUCATION

I hope our families enjoyed the holiday break and enjoyed special times together and some well deserved rest. We have a busy term ahead with lots of fun learning experiences planned.

Our First Nations students made tiles for a Kurna art installation last term and these have been fired and will be painted with oxides, glazed and will be completed very soon. We hope to install these tiles near our Rebound wall area to complement the existing murals, painted by Scott Rathman in 2021. Scott is designing artwork for new signage based on the students ideas and drawings during a workshop with Scott in Term 3.



We have updated our Kurna Acknowledgement of Country document and the students have created posters to be displayed in classrooms and other areas within our school. This Acknowledgement will be read before school assemblies, meetings and other important events to express our recognition, respect and plan of action to care for Kurna country.

Our First Nations students are learning basic Kurna language greetings and words and we practice these during our weekly sessions. We have been looking at various maps that show the many Australian Indigenous language and cultural groups and the students are learning to identify the locations of their family connections.

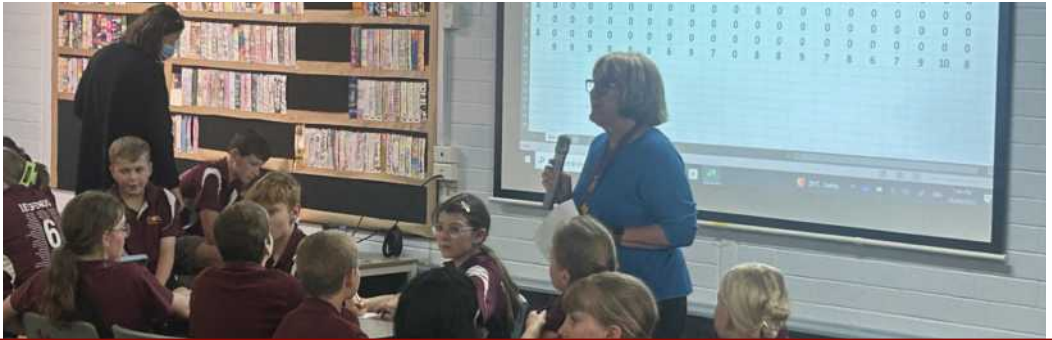

2024 Proposed Materials & Services Charge

Dear Parent / Caregiver

Following is information regarding the fee structure for students at Balaklava Primary School for 2024.

The procedures for School Charges for 2024 remain as they have for the past few years. Attached to this letter is a copy of the water-marked 2024 Material and Service Charge notice which has been approved by Department for Education.

We will be presenting this document to Governing Council on **Tuesday, October 31st** for approval. Should parents have any objection to the costs listed or wish to have any discussion about the charges, they are very welcome to attend this meeting which will be held in the Staffroom at the school at 7.00pm. If you are unable to attend the meeting, you are very welcome to forward in writing to the Principal or the Governing Council Chairperson, any comments pertaining to the charges.

If the charges are approved at this meeting, the 2024 M&S Charge for Balaklava Primary School will be \$290.00 per student. Previous to this, Fees for 2022 were \$275 and 2023 \$280.

Invoices will be posted early in January for all students.

To enable parents to pay for the M&S Charge prior to the commencement of the school year, the office will be open in the week prior to the commencement of the student year on dates yet to be confirmed. All credit cards are accepted along with cash and cheques for payment of the fees. EFTPOS facilities are available. Fees are payable using our QKR app for mobile phones also.

For those who are eligible for School Card, procedures have remained the same as last year i.e., both parents whose names appear on cards need to sign the form. Income limits and eligibility are based on the 2022/2023 financial year. The eligibility criterion for the 2024 School Card Scheme is based on whether the applicant's combined family gross income is within the School Card income limits. Eligibility is not dependent on any member of the family receiving any Centrelink benefits or Family Tax benefits. There are many different application forms for School Card. All forms will be available in January from the online portal at:

Should you need further information, please contact the School Office on 88621660 in the new year and we will provide any updated information. The online system is very user friendly and more expedient – we are very happy to assist anyone to complete the application online at school and can also provide a paper copy.

OPTIONS FOR PAYING M&S FEES & INVOICES

In 2024 we will continue to offer multiple ways to pay items which are associated with the school, i.e., school fees, camps etc. Listed below are some of these options:

- Payment can be made **in person** with either **cash, cheque or EFTPOS** at the Front Office.
- Payments can be made over the phone using **credit or debit card** details.
- If you believe you are entitled to School Card, you **MUST** fill out a form **EACH** year (cut-off date will be November 2024) and submit it to the school or to the School Card Section (using the online platform). Forms and details available at Front Office.
- Payments can be made using the **QKR app** which can be downloaded onto your mobile phone from Play Store (for Android) or App Store (I-Phone).
BCCC parents – App download instructions are included in your Enrolment Pack – we are also happy to help you at our Front desk.
