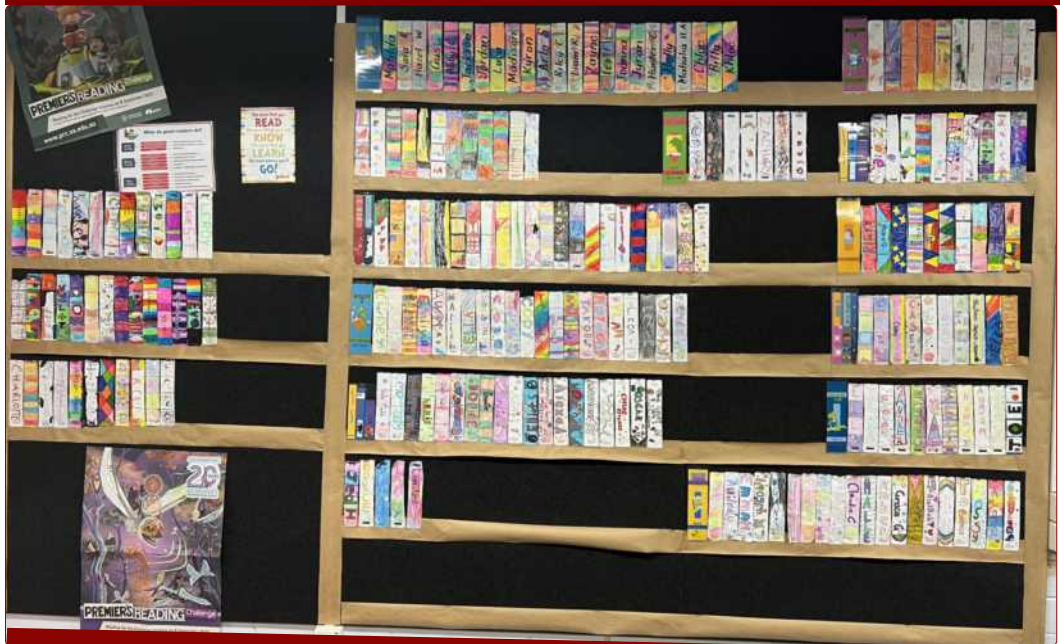

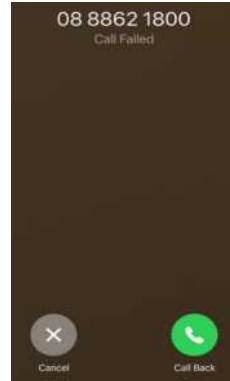

COVID-19 UPDATE



Covid update

Please ensure you contact us as soon as possible if your child tests positive to Covid or are a close contact. There are notification requirements for the Department as well as requirements regarding notifying staff and families.

We do have a Covid Positive Notification form available on Audiri for families to provide us with the information we require. Please be reminded that if students are unwell, they must not attend school. Please see pages 20-21 for updated information.

Illness

It is extremely important that we minimise the spread of illness.



The best way to stop the spread is to ensure that your child does not attend school when unwell. Students must stay home for **24 hours** after their last symptom, however, to ensure you child is completely recovered, we do strongly encourage you to keep your child home for **48 hours** after their last symptom. It takes everyone doing the right thing to ensure we can limit the impact for all students and staff.

Kindy

The classroom visits from Kindy children who will be starting at BPS in 2024 will increase this term. This is an opportunity for the children and their families to build confidence about their approaching time at BPS and for us all to get to know the students a little better.

Classes:

It is that time of the school year that staff are thinking forward to 2024. It is extremely important that we know your intentions for 2024 in order to have class numbers as accurate as possible. If you know of anyone moving into the area, please encourage them to book a time to meet with myself. Please send me an email, text or give me a ring if your children will not be attending Balaklava Primary next year. We appreciate your support in helping to make this process as streamlined as possible.

Placements:

The class placement process will begin as soon as we have the structures in place. This process is completed over a number of weeks and staff work hard to ensure we place students carefully in regards to class size and structure. We also try to ensure we put together groups of students who will work and learn well together.

To do this we consider:

- The learning needs of each child.
- A good balance of boys and girls.
- Learning abilities.
- Each child's friendship needs.

Teachers will give strong consideration to each child's friendship needs. If friends do not work well together, teachers may decide not to put them into the same class. School is a time to learn to develop new friendships. A new class and a new school year is an ideal time to make new friends.

A few children have very special learning or health needs. If you believe that your child has such needs, we will strive to do our very best to take this into consideration when we finalise classes, but due to a range of complexities, this may not always be possible.

While we welcome letters regarding other parental considerations, we must stress that requests will be considered but are not always possible. We do ask that you do not request specific teachers as staffing for 2024 has not been confirmed.

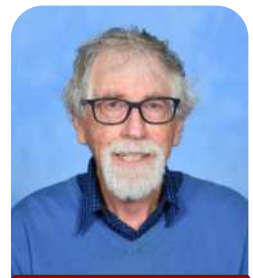

Soccer



Everyday in Week 2, Term 4, all the Reception to Year 3 students have been enjoying learning and developing their skills and techniques in Soccer with our professional coach, Michael. The Soccer Clinic is made possible due to Sporting Schools, an Australian Government initiative designed to help schools increase children's participation in sport and connect them with community sport opportunities.

Sporting Schools programs are provided free to children to help students build the confidence and capability to be active for life. To help achieve this, the Australian Sports Commission has partnered with more than 35 national sporting organisations (NSOs) and national sporting organisations for people with disability (NSODs). For this we are extremely grateful, that our students at Balaklava Primary School can be involved and experience sport, teamwork and the joy of being active in our community.

GOVERNING COUNCIL NEWS

2024 Materials & Services Charge

At the last meeting held 31/10/23, the 2024 M&S charge was discussed and approved to be \$290/student. We will continue to offer a discount if full fees are paid by end of Wk1 T1 2024.

For those who are eligible for School Card, procedures will remain the same as this year.

2024 additional levies and charges will remain the same. Swim \$15, Performance \$30 (4 plus) or \$10 each and IT levy \$10. Camps and excursions with costs etc will be notified as they occur.

Invoices will be posted early in January for all students. Registration Days/Pack pick ups will be held in Wk0 T1 as per previous years. More information will be sent out at later date.

2023 Materials & Services Charge/Debt Collection

We are disappointed to note that there are a few families who have not completed their obligation to make payment to BPS and in some cases making no response at all. The school simply cannot afford to carry overdue accounts and it is unfair on the rest of the school community to ask them to bear more than their fair share of the burden.

At the same above meeting, debtors were put forward with debt collection proceeding recommendations. Governing Council is aware of the BPS steps taken to recoup outstanding fees and in the majority of cases where no positive response has been received, these debtors were approved to be moved onto the DfE debt collection department for commencement of legal proceedings .

BPS requests for payment will be issued for a final time at the 2023 School Card Application close mid November. From this time the matter will handled by DfE.

Baloklava Primary is very lucky to have the vast majority of families acknowledge and action M&S payments and instalment plans. We are very grateful for this.

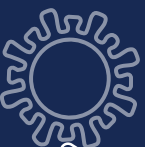

Students and staff who are COVID-19 positive or are a close contact cannot attend an overnight camp during the 7-day period following testing positive or following exposure.

*People who have recovered from COVID-19 will not be considered a close contact for 28 days after testing positive.





Close contact information

If you have had close contact with someone who has COVID-19, you are at an increased risk of getting COVID-19. Close contact includes living with or having spent a lot of time indoors with someone with COVID-19.

People with COVID-19 are considered infectious two days before their symptoms started, or two days before their positive COVID-19 test was taken if they have no noticeable symptoms.

If you are a close contact, there are important things you can do to reduce the risk to others:

- Monitor for symptoms. If you get sick you should get tested and stay at home until you are well.
- Don't visit people at high risk of severe illness, or anyone in a hospital, or an aged or disability care facility. If you have to visit, do a rapid antigen test before you go.
- Wear a mask when in indoor places and on public transport.
- Frequent rapid antigen testing to help identify an infection early. This is particularly important if you are in contact with people at high risk of severe illness.
- Notify your employer, school or childcare setting that you are a close contact.

Following these close contact guidelines for at least 7 days will help to protect our community, in particular people at risk or with health vulnerabilities, while you are potentially infectious.

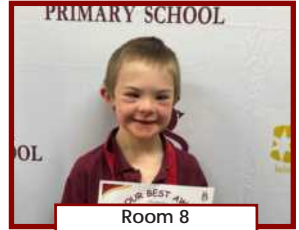
