

BE OUR BEST - SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL

In Term 4, students have been looking at socialemotional blockers such as; worry/anxiety, feeling down, anger, not paying attention

and procrastination. They are called blockers as they block our road to success and happiness.

In BOB lessons, students listen to stories about characters experiencing blockers and develop ideas to overcome them. Throughout the week, students have been using these strategies to overcome blockers that were affecting their schoolwork,

homework or playing/working with classmates.



'When I'm feeling down, I tell myself to think about nice things like fluffy unicorns and funny things like fire-breathing chickens' Alivia B.

When procrastinating 'I tell myself just to do my work so I can finish it and go out and play. I'm proud of myself when I finish my work' Khaleesi D.

Teachers also discussed that sometimes the brain is full of busy thoughts that are jumping around and moving all over the place. It can feel like we can't control our brain, and it's racing around and working all on its own, full of thoughts whether we want it to be or not. This happens to everyone from time to time and when it does, we can say we have a 'busy brain'. Students learned two things they can do and two things they can say to calm a busy brain. During the week, the students practiced using these strategies when they noticed their mind was preoccupied. They then discussed with the class what they liked and didn't like about these strategies.

Eva McC from Ber 4 tells herself to just focus and has a few deep breath, if it doesn't work I would tell my brain that I can only do one thing at a time. - *Michelle P*

PREPARING FOR A BUSHFIRE

Make a bushfire survival plan and practice with your family.

Review who is authorised to collect your child on your behalf.

Call the emergency information hotline 1800 000 279 for information if the school or preschool is threatened by a bushfire.



Identify your local radio station that broadcasts emergency information.



Read and save the 'Bushfire and your child's school or preschool' brochure.



Preparing for a bushfire

Our school/preschool has detailed plans in place to keep your child safe on catastrophic fire days or in the event of a bushfire.

To help us keep your child as safe as possible, parents and caregivers can prepare for the fire danger season by:

- making a bushfire survival plan with your family
- providing us with your up-to-date contact details
- advising the school/preschool if your family's personal bushfire survival plan will impact school attendance
- talking to your child about what will happen in a bushfire emergency
- liking the CFS, SES and SAPOL pages on Facebook
- adding the emergency information hotline 1800 000 279 to your contacts.

Parents and caregivers should also read and save the new <u>bushfire and your child's school or preschool</u> brochure. This resource explains what our <u>school/preschool</u> will do on a catastrophic fire day or in the event of a fire.
