COMPETITION RULES & INFORMATION

- 1. All students will be required to wear a school polo or singlet when competing.
- Competitors may run in 1 race only. Age is taken on December 31st in the year of competition.
- Competitors must assemble in the marshalling area 20 minutes prior to the starting time of the event.

4. THE START:

- (a) Short whistle blast 1 minute before the starting time will alert competitors to be ready for the starter's call.
- (b) Starting time command will be: "COMPETITORS TAKE YOUR MARKS".
- (c) Starter will then fire the gun.
- Appropriate athletics clothing is essential. Competitors will not be permitted to run in tracksuit pants however sports garments below the knees e.g. Skins are permitted. Spikes are permitted in events for runners who are 13 years and older.
- 6. IPODS

Runners are not permitted to use an ipod (or similar) whilst competing.

8. INDIVIDUAL AWARDS:

- (a) Secondary: Medals will be awarded to the three fastest runners in all events
- (b) All Primary competitors will receive a SAPSASA Participation Certificate.




