## ThinkUKnow Australia Cyber Safety Presentation at Balaklava Primary School

On Thursday, June 6th, Balaklava Primary School hosted an insightful presentation by ThinkUKnow Australia, a leading cyber safety education program. Aimed at informing parents, carers, and teachers about the intricacies of technology and online safety, the session shed light on the challenges individuals might encounter online and provided strategies to keep our children safe online.

ThinkUKnow Australia is a collaborative effort between the Australian Federal Police, Microsoft Australia, Datacom, and the Commonwealth Bank. Working closely with South Australia Police the program aims to equip communities with the knowledge and tools

necessary to promote online safety.

The presentation, was delivered by Senior Constable Rich Osborn, who discussed crucial topics concerning children and young people's online experiences. From privacy and security to navigating relationships and maintaining a positive online reputation, attendees gained valuable insights into the digital landscape. Moreover, the session provided an overview of the devices, websites, apps, and social networking platforms commonly used by young individuals today.

For parents, carers, and educators, this presentation was a fantastic opportunity to deepen their understanding of the online world and learn practical strategies to support

young people in becoming safe and responsible users of technology.

On the 28th June, the school will hold cyber-safety sessions for all our students, to explicitly teach students skills of how to protect themselves online, as well as how to navigate difficult situations.

## Register now for reception in 2025!



In South Australia, the first year of primary school is called reception. Children who turn 5 years old:

- before 1 May can start school in term 1
- between 1 May and 31
   October can start school in term 3 (mid-year intake)
- after 31 October can start the next year.

Children who start school at the beginning of the year will complete 4 terms of reception.

Children who start school in a mid-year intake will complete 6 terms of reception.

## Dear parent/caregiver

At a time when the cost of living pressures are being felt by many families, the South Australian Government is acting to deliver financial relief towards the cost of public education.

We want to reduce financial stress for families as much as we can

That is why, as part of the 2024-25 State Budget, families with school-aged children will receive a \$200 discount per child on their public school's Materials and Services Charge for 2025 - double the discount amount provided for 2022, 2023 and 2024.

You don't need to do anything to claim the discount - it will automatically be applied by your school.

The discount does not apply to families approved for the School Card scheme as these families are not required to pay a Materials and Services Charge.

Information on School Card eligibility, income limits and the application process can be found at: SA.GOV.AU - School Card scheme (www.sa.gov.au)

We hope this increased discount will provide some relief.

## A CALL OUT TO ALL OUR HISTORIANS

Do you or do you know anyone who can help?

I am currently trying to research information about our House Team names. Our 4 House Teams are named after 4 closed schools in the area: East Cameron; later known as Nantawarra school, Preston, Brightwood and Dalkey.

I have been able to find out the following information;

## BRIGHTWOOD

As the bullock drivers reached the top of the sandhill that marked the end of the Devil's Garden, the most treacherous part of their journey to the Port was over, and the outlook thereon was bright, hence they called the hilltop, Bright Outlook. It is from this name and that the school which was built of Murray Box timber; the school was called Brightwood School. In 1889 the area became submerged in floodwaters that could not escape, the school was flooded and a boat was required to rescue articles from the building, via the window. In 1892 the school was rebuilt to higher ground a little to the north-west. The school closed in 1943.

A different source reported that the school opened in 1878 and closed in 1937.

## **PRESTON**

Preston is to the south-west of Balaklava. The Preston school opened in section 540, about 1878. It closed in the vicinity of 1913. Due to an increase of children in the area in the late 1920s the school reopened and continued until 1937 when it closed permanently. 1878-1937 In 1885 a Mr Graham was teacher at Preston school, he was a very keen cricketer and encouraged the boys to play the game. He stayed at the school for a long time and due to his efforts the Preston Cricket Club was formed in 1894. They played on a dirt wicket in a paddock owned by John Saint. Later a concrete pitch was laid on Kirkland's farm.

## CAMERON

Cameron East – changed to Nantawarra. We haven't found much information on Cameron so any information would be helpful. 1873-1968

## DALKEY

1879-1964

A new school was built at Dalkey in 1905 and <u>closed in 1917</u> during <u>World War I</u>. Dalkey was named after the seaside resort in Dublin, Ireland.

I gave our House Captains the job of researching the names of their teams as I thought it would be interesting for students to be aware of the origin of the team names. When we all began our research we quickly found out that we needed to draw upon local knowledge. Hoping that someone in our community can assist.
