Year 3/4 Science

Room 2 students carried out some extra activities during Science Week. We placed celery in different coloured water for 24 hours and watched the celery change colour. The green leaves were particularly vibrant. Our white daisies in coloured water took about 3 days to colour up. We had blue, green, yellow and pink ones. Another activity involved placing m and ms around a paper plate and then gently adding warm water to the middle of the plate to see what would happen. Interesting patterns were created as the water drew the colour from the m and ms. Our last activity involved immersing fresh eggs into vinegar and watching what happened over 2 days. The eggs became soft, lost their shells and felt quite rubbery. Unfortunately a couple broke but we were able to attempt bouncing the third egg on a table with some success. - Jenny Rowland















Exciting News from Science Week 2024 at Balaklava Primary School!

This year's Science Week was an absolute hit, with our students diving headfirst into the theme "Species Survival - More Than Just Sustainability." During week 4, our students engaged in a variety of activities that highlighted the importance of conservation and the beauty of our natural world.

One of the highlights was a lunchtime activity where students created stunning handpainted artwork of endangered animals. Each piece was a masterpiece, reflecting not only the creativity of our students but also their deep commitment to raising awareness about species conservation.

The excitement continued as our students embraced their inner detectives on a nature walk. exploring the vibrant colours that surround us every day. From the deepest greens to the brightest blues, our young scientists identified a rainbow of hues in the natural world. It was a fantastic way to blend science with outdoor adventure!

Science in Action!

Our students also delved into the fascinating world of capillary action with the "Rainbow Walking Water" experiment. This hands-on activity demonstrated how plants draw water up from their roots, using simple materials like water, paper towels, food colouring, and a bit of gravity. The result was a mesmerising moving rainbow, visually representing how nature's water transport system works!

IScience Week

Science Competition

Our Students Shine in the Science Week Competition!

This year, our students at Balaklava Primary School had the exciting opportunity to participate in the Science Week competition, with the challenge to "Design an Innovative Farming Invention." We're thrilled to share that four of our talented students rose to the occasion and submitted innovative designs!

Each student approached the challenge with creativity and ingenuity, coming up with ideas that could revolutionise farming practices in the future. From eco-friendly solutions to cutting-edge technology, their designs reflected a deep understanding of the needs and challenges faced by modern agriculture.

Mariah created 'The sheep shearing robot', an advanced tool designed to streamline wool harvesting on the farm. It features a light on top of its head that signals when the shearing blades are ready for use, ensuring optimal performance. After shearing, the robot has a wool shooter to efficiently sort and pack the fleece, making the process more organised and less labour-intensive. This innovation enhances productivity while reducing the manual effort required for wool management.

Pip designed an automatic tractor equipped with a programmable timer that offers a game-changing convenience for farmers. By setting the timer, the farmer can schedule the tractor to automatically navigate the farm and distribute feed to the animals at designated times. This innovation allows farmers to get some much-needed rest while ensuring that their livestock are consistently fed and cared for. With the tractor handling the feeding routine, farmers can focus on other essential tasks or simply enjoy a well-deserved break.

Georgia developed a self-sufficient farming system harnessing environmental elements. Solar panels on the processing and distribution shed capture and store energy from sunlight, powering the shed. Rainwater is collected in tanks from the shed's gutters and used in a gravity-fed irrigation system to water the fruits and vegetables in the greenhouses. This integrated approach optimises resource use and supports sustainable farming practices.

Azaylia drew her design of a fence that keeps out foxes. To protect livestock from foxes, this well-constructed fence is essential. The fence is six feet tall and made of sturdy materials. Azaylia explained that the foxes won't be able to dig underneath, as it is the best made fence in Australia.

We're incredibly proud of these young inventors for their hard work and dedication. Their innovative thinking and problem-solving skills have truly shone through in this competition, showcasing the bright futures they have ahead of them in science and technology.

A huge congratulations to Mariah, Pip, Georgia and Azaylia for their remarkable efforts. We can't wait to see where their inventive minds will take them next!
