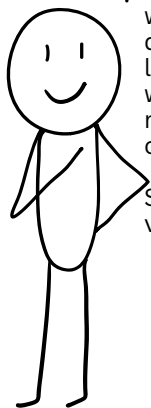
Fathers Day Stall

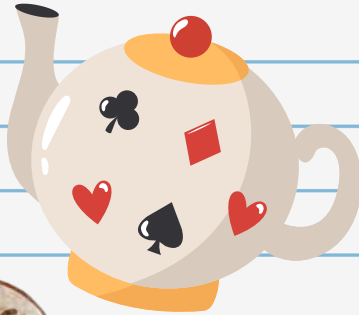

ONE OFF BUS TRAVEL PERMISSION

On occasion there may be need for parents to request a **1 OFF bus travel permission** for their child/children. It may be to go to another relative for after school care, attend a friend's birthday party etc. In these instances the **REQUEST to TRAVEL** form on Audiri must be completed. The form contains all relevant details necessary including emergency contacts and medical needs. If the time is later than 1:30pm on the day of travel, you must contact the Front Office as well.

On receipt of the Audiri form, our records are checked to see if there is actually enough room on that bus for your child to travel. If yes, the driver is then notified by BPS. If the answer is no, we will notify you.

Unfortunately, we can no longer accept written notes granting permission for your child to travel on a specific bus.

We appreciate your understanding and co-operation in this matter. Should you have any questions or need further assistance, please feel free to contact the school.

History in HASS

In HASS last term for History, Ber 2, Room 2, Ber 4, Room 18, and Room 20 each undertook a research project. Ber 2, Room 2 and Ber 4 investigated the journey of the First Fleet, while Room 18 and 20 researched significant events in Australia's colonial history that were part of the journey towards Federation. At assembly last week we shared some of the fantastic posters students made, and here are a selection of presentations students made digitally.

The First Fleet

Australia's "First Fleet" was a group of 11 ships and about 1,400 people who established the first European settlements in Botany Bay and Sydney.

Transportation to the Australian colonies began in 1788 when the First Fleet, carrying between 750 and 780 convicts plus 550 crew, soldiers and family members, landed at Sydney Cove after an eight-month voyage. Over the next 80 years, British courts sentenced more than 160,000 convicts to transportation to Australia.

Arthur Bowes Smyth (1750-1790) was the ship's surgeon aboard the Lady Penrhyn, one of the ships in the First Fleet. In his journal, Smyth wrote of the harsh conditions aboard the Lady Penrhyn whose passengers included 101 female convicts. The names of the convicts are listed on pages 17-20 of Smyth's journal.

The First Fleet was a fleet of 11 British ships that took the first British colonists and convicts to Australia. It comprised two Royal Navy vessels, three store ships and six convict transports. On 13 May 1787 the fleet, under the command of Captain Arthur Phillip, with over 1,400 people (convicts, marines, sailors, civil officers and free settlers), left from Portsmouth, England and took a journey of over 24,000 kilometres (15,000 mi) and over 250 days to eventually arrive in Botany Bay, New South Wales, where a penal colony would become the first British settlement in Australia from 20 January 1788.



James Cook

James Cook was a British naval captain, navigator, and explorer who sailed the seaways and coasts of Canada and conducted three expeditions to the Pacific Ocean (1768-71, 1772-75, and 1776-79), ranging from the Antarctic ice fields to the Bering Strait and from the coasts of North America to Australia and New Zealand.

The final secret goal was to continue the search for the Great South Land. Cook reached the southern coast of New South Wales in 1770 and sailed north, charting Australia's eastern coastline and claiming the land for Great Britain on 22nd August 1770.

Cook climbed to the highest point of Possession Island and named the east coast of the Australian continent for Britain. In his journal, Cook wrote: "so far as we know [Australia] does not produce any one thing that can become an Article in trade to invite Europeans to fix a settlement upon it."



Eureka Stockade Rebellion, Victoria

When, where and why did the event occur?

December 3rd 1854, Ballarat Victoria – Australia November 30th miners at Ballarat in Victoria swore allegiance to the Southern Cross flag at Bakery Hill and built a stockade at the near-by Eureka diggings, miners digging for gold

Why did the event occur and what was the result?

A disagreement over what gold miners felt were unfair laws and policing of their work by the government. A fairer goldfields system with the license replaced by the cheaper miners' right, giving miners the right to vote

Why was it significant or important?

Because the Eureka stockade is the birthplace of Australian democracy

What happened and who was involved?

The battle of the Eureka stockade only lasted 15 minutes with at least 22 diggers including one woman and six soldiers losing their lives

Why did the event occur and what was the result?

A disagreement over what gold miners felt were unfair

How do we know about the event?

We have proof, there is a museum about the event that has books, flags and letters that were involved in the event.



The Eureka Stockade

The Eureka stockade started on 30th November 1854.

The government troops attacked the stockade, and at least 22 miners and 5 soldiers were killed.

A disagreement over what gold miners felt were unfair laws and policing of their work by government.



In June 1851 the Victorian government also reported discoveries of gold.

The Eureka rebellion as an historical event is well known among Australians.

The legacy of Eureka. The Eureka Rebellion as an historical event is well known among Australians.

How do we know about it:

Hundreds of men encircle flag pole with Eureka flag at the top.



Journey to New Holland

Who was James Cook? British explorer and cartographer

Why was the voyage of the endeavour significant? It was the beginning of the British colonisation of Australia.

What was life like in Britain during the 1700s? Britain was the wealthiest country in the world.

Why did the British decided to colonise New Holland? The prisons in Britain had become unbearably over crowded.

What ships made up the First Fleet? Alexander, Borrowdale, Charlotte, Fishburn, Friendship, Golden Grove, Lady Penrhyn, Prince of Wales, Supply, Sirius, Scarborough

Who was on board the ships? Marines, officials, seamen, their wives and children and at least 775 prisoners of the crown.

What was life aboard the ships living conditions were cramped the work was hard tedious disobedience was met with swift and harsh punishment, and the risk death from disease or misadventure was high.

What was the journey like where did they go? Why did they go there what were the conditions like? The ships were very crowded and food and water were strictly rationed.

What was life like in the new colony? The settlers only had food they brought when they arrived.

What impact did the arrival of the First Fleet have on First Nations Australians? Dispossession from their land, exploitation and violence.

James Cook was born October 27th 1728. He died February 14th, 1779.

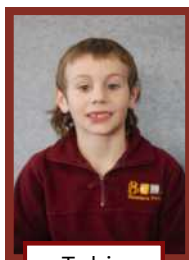

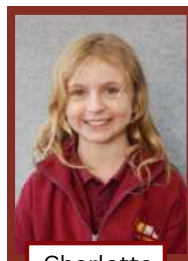

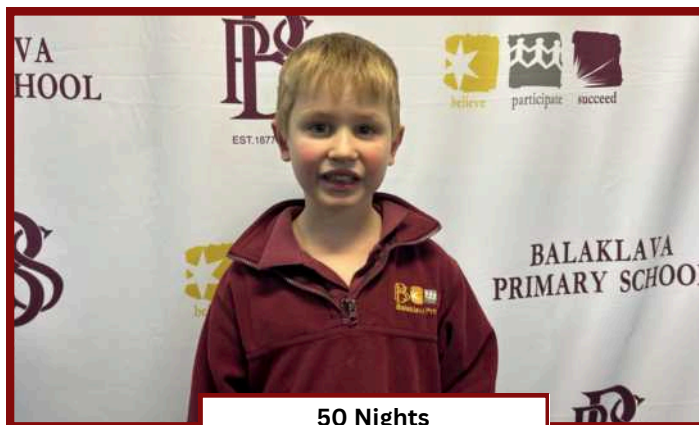

Trials are open to students in year 5 and 6 who wish to be considered for selection in the CENTRAL COUNTRY Sapsasa district team to compete in the Cricket-Girls Sapsasa State Carnival. Trials are run in a safe and supportive learning environment to select a district team to compete at the Cricket-Girls State Sapsasa Carnival.

Students will be involved in drills and competitive scenarios to select a team based on the following criteria:

- Ability and game sense in the sport
- Coachability (Effort, Teamwork, positive attitude, listening and responding to feedback)

Transport: Parents/Caregivers are responsible for organising transport to and from the trials.

Requirements: Students must wear appropriate school sports top, bring sunscreen, sufficient food and drink along with any sport specific equipment (eg cricket helmets, bats, pads, gloves etc).

Supervision: Students will be under the supervision of the teacher team official and other identified responsible persons (with appropriate WWCC) to ensure supervision ratios are met.

Contingency plans: If unforeseen circumstances mean the trials are unable to go ahead, families and schools will be notified as soon as possible. Trials will either be rescheduled if time permits, or an alternate venue will be organised.

- Please note the school has the right to not approve a child's involvement in the carnival based on behaviour, attendance and other grounds as determined by the school.
