**Cameron:** We had to use all different key points; resilience, participation and much more to do the different activities on camp like body boarding, kayaking and surf ed.

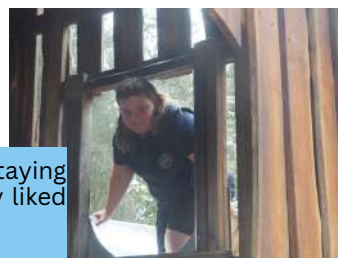


**Sid:** We went to the water park on camp and it was fun.

- The school and pool canteens is not open to Primary School students on Swimming Carnival Day.
- Parents are asked to bring a chair and your food supplies as the pool canteen will not be open.
- **If you wish to take your child home after the carnival, you must sign them out at the front office which will be open from 1:00 pm.** Please speak with their teacher to let them know they you will be signing your child out at the end of the carnival.
- School students are the responsibility of the school staff throughout the carnival and are expected to remain with their class/house team. Please understand that students are not allowed to stay with families unless you are signing them out and they are then officially no longer part of the carnival and are your responsibility.
- Students not taking part in the Swimming Carnival will be supervised at school for the day.
- Students who are showing poor sportsmanship will also be taken back to school and a parent will be contacted to collect their child.

- If your child is not participating in the day, then parents may decide to keep their child at home. Please notify us ASAP of their absence.

# Mid Year Enrolments

## Getting ready for reception



In South Australia, the first year of primary school is called reception. Children who turn 5 years old:

- **before 1 May** can start school in term 1
- **between 1 May and 31 October** can start school in term 3 (mid-year intake)
- **after 31 October** can start the next year.

Children who start school at the beginning of the year will complete 4 terms of reception.

Children who start school in a mid-year intake will complete 6 terms of reception.

## What to expect from reception

Reception is where students discover school practices, routines and structure. Students will experience active learning, including play-based and inquiry-based approaches, as well as structured learning to develop literacy and numeracy skills. This includes commencing learning in all 8 areas of the curriculum (English, maths, science, humanities and social sciences, the arts, technologies, health and physical education and languages).

All children have different interests, needs and motivations. Teachers provide learning opportunities tailored to the child and continually review progress to support their learning.

In reception, students continue to develop decision making, problem solving and thinking skills, as well as collaboration, communication and a positive sense of self. Developing independence is a focus.

## Mid-year intake and 6 terms of reception

Students will have the same types of learning experiences whether they start at the beginning or middle of the year.

Students starting in a mid-year intake complete 6 terms of reception. They may enter a new reception class or join an existing class. This depends on enrolment numbers and the size of existing classes at your school.

Your child's teacher will plan, teach and assess all learners and ensure they are making progress with their learning.

## Planning your child's transition to school

Preschools and schools have transition programs to support children moving from preschool into reception.

These programs help children settle into new routines, develop a sense of belonging at their new school, and build skills and concepts as they learn at their own pace.

Families play a significant role in supporting a successful transition to school. Speak to your preschool or primary school to find out more.

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# SCIENCE+

For the last two weeks in Science, we have been participating in STEM (Science Technology Engineering Mathematics) challenges. These have included : Constructing a marble maze, designing and constructing a bubble wand, Magnetic Magic, Building a stable tower structure using straws and tape, building a paper bridge, aluminium boat challenge, building a stable structure using spaghetti and marshmallows, designing and constructing a moving toy, building a balloon powered car, constructing a working catapult using only 3 different materials, and designing and making a rocket that can be launched with a straw.

It was great to see the students focused and engaged on the different challenges, using their problem solving skills and imagination to complete each of the STEM challenges.

**Charlotte:** Swimming lessons was fun but challenging because we had to do side stroke.

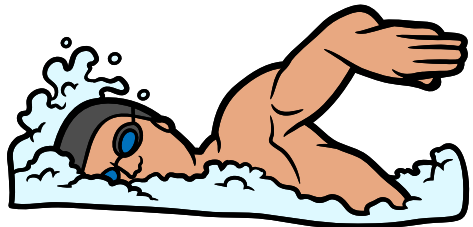
**Levi:** I enjoyed freestyle in swimming lessons.

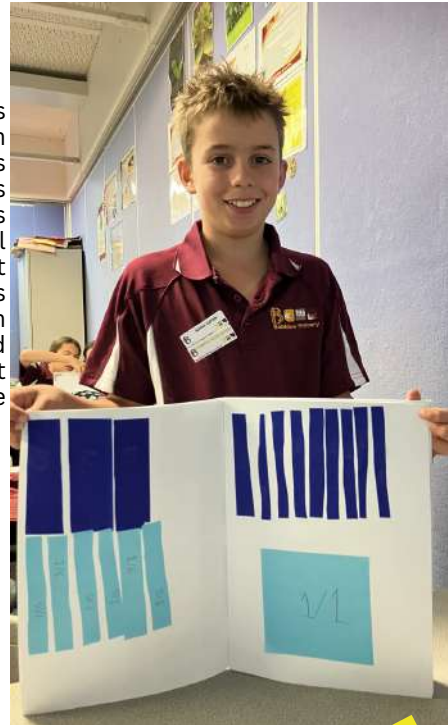


## FRACTIONS
