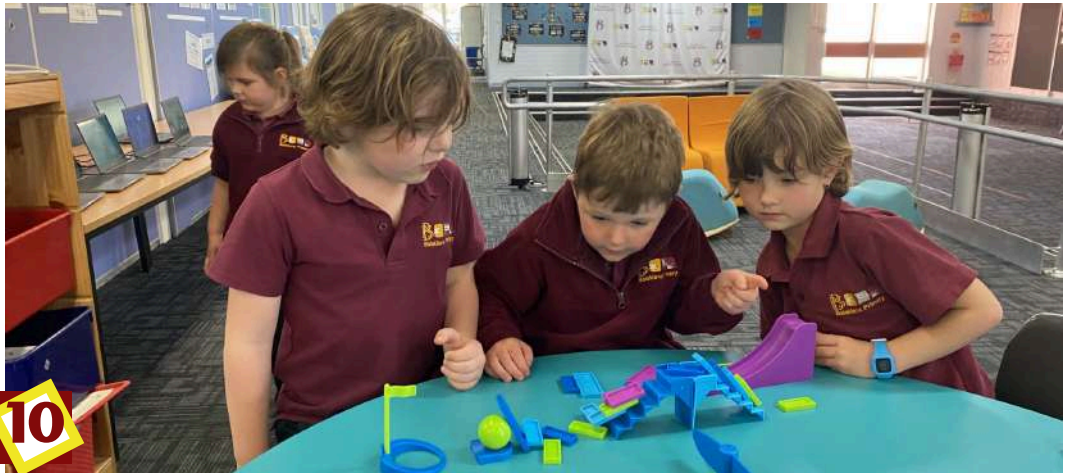
It is crunch time for Children's Uni students as we are now on the final stretch to accumulate the hours needed to graduate.

## Div 1 Country Champions at SAPSASA Netball State Carnival

### Report for Mid North SAPSASA Netball Division 1 and Division 3 from State Carnival

After an exceptional 3 days of netball in very trying conditions the Division 1 Mid North side were able to take out the Championship, a feat that has not been seen in the events 72 years history records. The Division 3 side also had an exceptional carnival finishing in 3<sup>rd</sup> place.

The carnival kicked off on a cool winter's day, with chilly strong winds setting the scene. Despite the brisk conditions, the girls showcased their skills with impressive victories across the board for the Division 3 side and 2 wins and a draw for the Division 1 side. The Mid North team song was sung loud and proud by all the girls!



Both teams started strong with a comfortable win against Northern. The division 3 match against Riverland was a closer contest, but the team adapted well to the wet weather, securing a 6-goal victory. The Division 1 side were down by a couple of goals all game against Riverland, however some team changes paid off to equal the score at the final buzzer. The day ended on a high note on the inside courts where the girls showcased their skills taking the wins against Central Eyre Peninsula. The day concluded with a delightful team bonding session at the West Beach Surf Lifesaving Club, where the girls strengthened their connections and enjoyed some well-deserved fun.

Tuesday promised to be a challenging day, with wintery conditions and consistent showers. The girls started strong with a comfortable win against Lower South East, although the wet socks were less than ideal! Both teams continued their winning streak defeating Mid South East and Upper South East with ease. By the end of Day 2, the girls were cold, wet, and tired but ready to gear up for a big Day 3.

With medal hopes in sight, both teams needed strong performances against Lower Eyre Peninsula and Southern Fleurieu. Despite a valiant effort, the Division 3 side couldn't overcome Lower EP, losing by 5 goals. The match against Southern Fleurieu was evenly contested, but the opponents proved to be a well-drilled team, taking the win by 9 goals. With the pressure off, the girls embraced the final game of the carnival, playing with joy and determination. They finished with a 9-goal victory against Northern YP, securing a commendable 3<sup>rd</sup> place finish in the carnival.

The Division 1 side had a hard fought game against Lower EP, sticking to their game plan to take the win by 5 goals. They then focussed on the clash with Southern Fleurieu, knowing this was going to be an exceptionally hard match. They went into the game with positivity and determination. Despite being down by a few goals at 3 quarter time the girls never

dropped their heads. Changes were made and with some exceptional defensive pressure all across the court and making the most of every opportunity the team came away with a 1 goal win. This was like a Grand Final match for each of the girls and they all stood up to the challenge. The team finished the carnival with another great win over Northern Yorke Peninsula taking out the Gold medal!

Coach, Kylie Murphy, spoke to the girls at the conclusion of their last match about how proud she was of the grit, determination and sportsmanship they had all displayed across the 3 days. The memories they had made, both on and off the court, would stay with them forever.

The Championship winning Division 1 team consisted of a group of talented young netballers from across the Mid North, Aurora Wilden (Riverton Primary), Grayce Kelman (Manoora Primary), Coby Greenshields (Balaklava Primary), Rue Madrio (Port Wakefield Primary), Isla Parker (Watervale Primary), Koda Maher (Clare Primary), Sophia Duncan, Clara Ottens, Matilda Manhood and Maya Beart-McKay (St Joseph's, Clare) and coached by Kylie Murphy (St Joseph's). Kylie said it was an absolute honour to coach the girls, although a little stressful at times during the nail biter games. The girls played some exceptional netball across the three days, combining well as a team, listening to the coaching advise given and working hard right to the final whistle. We were very lucky to get over the line in a couple of the games and this was an absolute credit to the girls.

The Division 3 team showcased local Mid North talent Eva Yard (Saddleworth), Brooklyn Williams (Auburn), Charlise Elsworthy & Ella Lennon (Balaklava), Elsie Angus & Isla Zweck (Blyth), Violet Lange (Koolunga), Ruby Kells, Ruby Mason & Violet Wood (St Joseph's) and coached by Chloe Cook (Clare). Chloe was impressed with the girl's netball skills, determination and emphasised how proud they should be of their efforts throughout the carnival. As coaches we couldn't ask for more of the girls, their teamwork and sportsmanship was excellent.

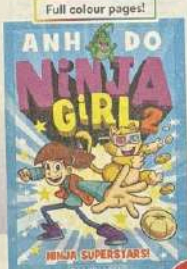

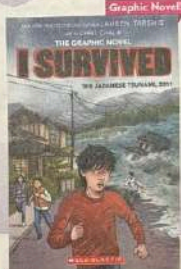

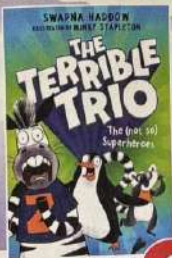

# SILO ART PROJECT - LET'S BRING IT TO LIFE!

The Balaklava Silo Art Project, is an opportunity for your support in making this draw card for Balaklava a reality. Internationally acclaimed street artist Sam Bates (aka Smug) – the creative powerhouse behind the silo murals in Wirrabara and Lameroo – has officially agreed to take on the Balaklava silos.

What we do know is - silo art breathes new life into regional towns and is having a positive economic benefit on other towns.

If we can raise the required funds in time to match Smug's upcoming availability, and if this aligns with restraints around Viterra's harvest commitments, there's a glimmer of opportunity that the project could be complete by the end of 2025. If not, the project will roll out in 2026 – giving us more time to build community involvement, run fundraising events, and secure additional grants.

We have about \$17,000 at present and need at least \$60,000. Artist fee is \$53,150. The Silo Art Sub-Committee is actively pursuing grants, but most require matched funding. That's where you come in.

We're calling on local businesses, institutions, community members and individuals to consider contributing to the project. As a thank you, all sponsors will be recognised on signage at the silo site, giving you long-term visibility and a chance to be part of something truly iconic.
