2026 Planning Classes

It's that time of the school year when staff begin looking ahead to 2026. It is extremely important that we know your intentions for next year to ensure class numbers are as accurate as possible.

If you know of anyone moving into the area, please encourage them to book a time to meet with me (Dianna).

If your children will not be attending Balaklava Primary School in 2026, please let us know via email, text, or a phone call. Your support helps make this planning process more efficient.

Placements

The class placement process will begin as soon as our structures are in place. This process takes several weeks, and staff work carefully to ensure thoughtful placements, considering:

- The learning needs of each child
- A balanced mix of boys and girls
- Learning abilities
- Friendship needs

Teachers give strong consideration to friendship needs. However, if certain friendships negatively impact learning, students may be placed in separate classes. School is an opportunity to form new connections, and a new class provides a great chance to make new friends.

Some children have special learning or health needs. If you believe this applies to your child, we will do our very best to take this into account—but please note that due to various complexities, we may not always be able to accommodate all requests.

While we welcome parental input, please understand that requests while considered are not guaranteed. We also ask that you do not request specific teachers, as staffing for 2026 has not yet been confirmed.



All requests must be submitted via this Microsoft Forms link by Friday, 31st October.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

School Uniform

A reminder that all students are required to wear a hat while outside in the yard. Students without a hat will be reminded and asked to play in a designated 'no hat' area.

Students may trade a personal item (e.g. pencil case or water bottle) at the front office to borrow a hat for playtime. The borrowed hat must be returned to receive the item back. This process is called Mutual Exchange. Broad-brimmed BPS hats can be purchased via Qkr and collected from the front office. We will contact families to purchase a new hat if a student has vandalised (cut or drawn on) their hat.

Audiri Transition

As we advised last term, BPS is transitioning away from the Audiri app and moving to the Department for Education's new management system, including EdSmart. Starting next week, Audiri forms will be removed, and the app will soon be decommissioned altogether.

We understand this is a big change, especially for families who've used Audiri to submit:

- Absence notifications
- Contact Us forms
- Occasional bus travel requests
- Change of details

Please use the QR code provided to submit absence notifications.

You may also notify us of absence by contacting the office directly or sending a SeeSaw message to your child's teacher.



Once the new system is fully implemented, we hope to replicate some of the convenient forms used in Audiri. We will communicate with you as we learn more about the features of the new Management System.

Student Reports

This term, we will be using the new Education Management System to generate student reports for the first time.

At this stage, we are still finalising the process and templates, so reports *will look different* this semester. Once we have more clarity and confidence around the format and timelines, I will provide families with an update on:

- What the new reports will look like
- How they will be delivered
- When you can expect to receive them

Bushfire Season Information for Families

As we move into warmer months and the fire danger season (November 1 – April 30), we want to keep our school community informed and prepared.

We've included a link in the emailed newsletter to the "Bushfire and Your Child's School or Preschool" brochure, which explains:

- How our school prepares for bushfire season
- What happens on days of extreme or catastrophic fire danger
- How we will communicate with you in an emergency
- How you can prepare your family

Balaklava Primary School is rated R3.

This is not about creating worry—it's about being ready. Just like our fire drills, staying informed helps us all work together to keep our children safe.

We also review our Bushfire on Buses brochure annually. The current version is on our website; however, it still references Audiri as a contact method. This will be updated as part of the current review. The revised brochure will be shared with families via the Week 3 newsletter.

Signing in & out

Updated Student Sign-In/Sign-Out Procedure

Please be aware that we are now using a new system for student sign-ins and sign-outs.

Sign-In Procedure:

Students are no longer able to sign themselves in with just a parent present. Upon arrival, students must report to the front office. The front office staff will sign them in and provide a slip confirming they have completed the process. Students will then give this slip to the teacher.

Sign-Out Procedure:

When signing out, students must come to the front office. A parent or caregiver must be present to collect them. Once the parent/caregiver has arrived, the front office staff will complete the sign-out process.

Thank you to Professor Flint for your in site knowledge of Dinosaurs.

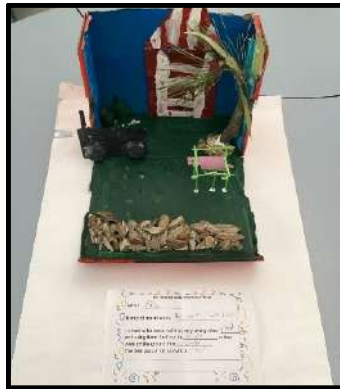
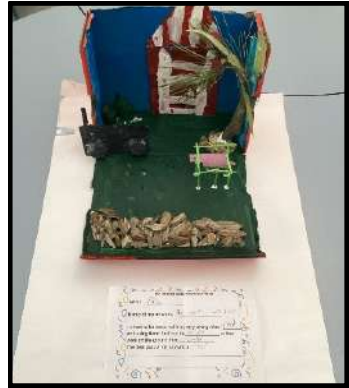


Recycle and take what we need.

Notification - 2026 Proposed Materials & Services Charge

Dear Parent / Caregiver

Included in the Newsletter is the information regarding the proposed fee structure for students at Balaklava Primary School in 2026.

The water-marked 2026 Material and Service Charge notice has been approved by DfE.

We will be presenting this document to Governing Council on **Tuesday, October 28th** for approval. Should parents have any objection to the costs listed or wish to have any discussion about the charges, they are very welcome to attend this meeting which will be held in the Staffroom at the school at 7.00pm. If you are unable to attend the meeting, you are very welcome to forward in writing to the Principal or the Governing Council Chairperson, any comments pertaining to the charges. Please email at dl.0477.info@schools.sa.edu.au

If the charges are approved at this meeting, the 2026 M&S Charge for Balaklava Primary School will be \$310.00 per student. Previous to this, Fees for 2025 were \$300, 2024 were \$290 and 2023 \$280.

The SA Government has confirmed that the \$200 M&S Rebate will continue into 2029, effectively making the 2026 full fee payment \$110 per student.

The procedures for School Card for 2026 remain as they have for the past few years. Income limits and eligibility are based on the 2024/2025 financial year. The eligibility criterion for the 2026 School Card Scheme is based on whether the applicant's combined family gross income is within the School Card income limits. Eligibility is not dependent on any member of the family receiving any Centrelink benefits or Family Tax benefits. There are many different application forms for School Card. All forms will be available in January from the online portal at:

Should you need further information, please contact the School Office on 88621660 in the new year and we will provide any updated information. The online system is very user friendly and more expedient – we are very happy to assist anyone to complete the application online at school and can also provide a paper copy.

Invoices will be emailed in January for all students.

To enable parents to pay for the M&S Charge prior to the commencement of the school year, the office will be open in the week prior to the start of the student year on dates yet to be confirmed. Payment options listed below.

OPTIONS FOR PAYING M&S FEES & INVOICES

In 2026 we will continue to offer multiple ways to pay items which are associated with the school, i.e., school fees, camps etc. Listed below are some of these options:

- Payment can be made **in person** with either **cash, cheque or EFTPOS**
- Payments can be made over the phone using **credit or debit card** details.
- Payments can be made using EFT BSB:0650000 Acc: 12133346
- EasyPay and/or the **QKR app** which can be downloaded onto your mobile phone from Play Store (for Android) or App Store (I-Phone).
BCCC parents – For detailed instructions on how to download and setup the App please contact our Front Office
- If you believe you are entitled to School Card, you **MUST** fill out a form **EACH** year (cut-off date will be mid November 2026) and submit it to the school or to the School Card Section (using the online platform). Forms and details available at Front Office.

Dear parent/caregiver

As cost of living pressures continue to affect many families, the South Australian Government is acting to deliver ongoing financial relief towards the cost of public education.

We want to reduce financial stress for families as much as we can and provide some reassurance for the coming years.

That is why, as part of the 2025-26 State Budget, families with school-aged children will continue to receive a \$200 discount per child on their public school's Materials and Services Charge for the next four years.

You don't need to do anything to claim the discount – it will automatically be applied by your school.

The discount does not apply to families approved for the School Card scheme as these families are not required to pay a Materials and Services Charge.

Stars on Stage – Celebrating Our Students

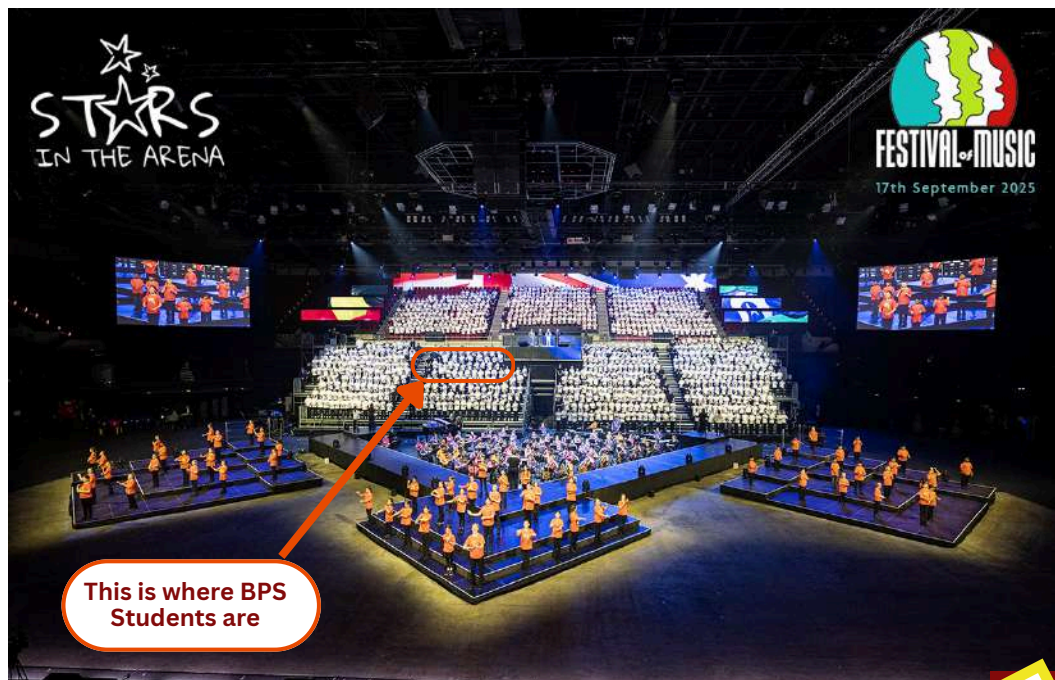
