Site Learning Plan

The Balaklava Primary School Site Learning Plan is focused on strengthening mathematics outcomes for all students. Students will participate with strong engagement in a daily maths review, designed to build resilience and automaticity. Teachers will deliver a daily review based on the Mathematics Curriculum and current class learning, providing it at least four times a week. This ensures lessons are engaging and consistent across all classes. Support staff will provide differentiated learning opportunities, encouraging students to work through challenges and develop critical thinking skills.

The best thing about camp was the Boogey Boarding, kayaking and Body boarding in a lake of fish. Felicity.





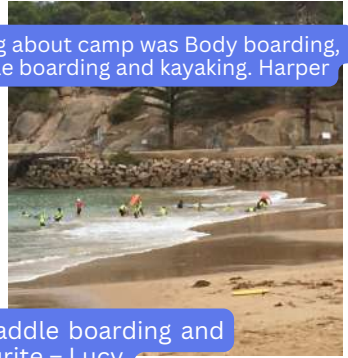

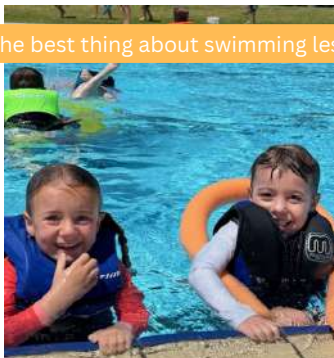

You can decide which intake suits your child best based on their age, maturity, social and emotional wellbeing and attitude.

Getting ready for reception



In South Australia, the first year of primary school is called reception. Children who turn 5 years old:

- **before 1 May** can start school in term 1
- **between 1 May and 31 October** can start school in term 3 (mid-year intake)
- **after 31 October** can start the next year.

Children who start school at the beginning of the year will complete 4 terms of reception.

Children who start school in a mid-year intake will complete 6 terms of reception.



Enrolment forms can be collected from BCCC from Week 5 and must be returned no later than the end of Week 7. Non BCCC starters can collect an enrolment pack from the BPS Office.

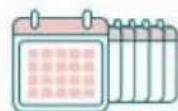
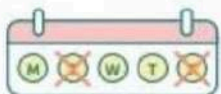

Children's University Learning Destinations (the fun places you will go to learn fun things) all have a Children's Uni Learning Destination sticker in the window. Students take their Passport to Learning with them, and once they have participated in the activity, they get a stamp for their time spent learning. The more activities students do, the more hours and stamps they will get to go in their passports and get closer to graduating.

Once students have collected enough hours, they will graduate in an iconic location where they will be presented with a certificate at a special ceremony, all dressed up in a cap and gown, just like the older university students.

GOVERNING COUNCIL

The Governing Council (GC) is an elected group of parents and staff that oversee the management and well-being of the school community and its assets. Members of Council are elected at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) and usually serve a two-year term. The tasks of Governing Council include:

- Keeping informed about the Site Learning Plan
- Advising the Principal of general community concerns and opinions
- Discussing educational policy
- Liaison with staff

The Governing Council meet in the evenings, twice per term.

Sub Committees have been formed to help share the responsibilities and decision making with greater number of parents who are not members of the GC. They then report back to the GC with any recommendations made by the committee, for the GC to vote on if necessary.

SUB COMMITTEES INCLUDE:

Fundraising:

Meets on a regular basis throughout the year to initiate, implement and support various fundraising activities throughout the year. These are usually day time meetings.

Finance:

Manages the school finances in consultation with the school community by developing an annual budget and monitoring expenditure and income throughout the year.

The Finance Committee meets twice per term, usually in the early evening, however the members of committee will discuss their availability to determine a suitable meeting time in 2026.

Canteen:

Representatives from the Primary School meet with representatives from the High School to oversee the management of the canteen, usually once per term. This is often an after school meeting.

Bus:

Review of bus routes, manages the bus policies and responds to other issues concerning the school buses as they arise. This committee meets once per term, at approximately 5pm.

Grounds & Facilities:

The general maintenance of the school grounds and buildings, including organising working bees and ensuring the school maintenance schedule is adhered to. This committee meet twice per term, usually around 5:30pm
