What Is Our Site Priority for 2026?

If you were asked, "What is the site priority at Balaklava Primary School in 2026?", would you be able to answer?

Each fortnight, staff focus on a different disposition derived from the South Australian Curriculum. We teach students a new strategy to add to their toolbox, helping them respond when they find themselves in a situation where they are unsure what to do—whether that is at school, at home, at sport or at the shops.

Each fortnight, we share information with families about:

- what we are doing at BPS to develop the strategy
- what we will be looking for students to demonstrate
- what families can do at home to help strengthen the strategy.

Please help us notice, acknowledge and celebrate when your children use these strategies.

BPS Hat Expectations

Children are required to wear Balaklava Primary School (BPS) uniform hats during break times and whenever lessons are held outdoors.



School hats are available for purchase from the Front Office or via Qkr!

Students who do not have a hat will be directed to play under the large shelter or gazebo during break times.

Students may borrow a hat from their classroom teacher; however, they will be required to leave a personal item (e.g. water bottle, pencil case) in exchange. Personal items will be returned once the borrowed hat has been returned. We call this "Mutual Exchange".

Please note, this process has changed from 2025. Previously, students were able to borrow hats from the Front Office.

A copy of the BPS Hat Expectations is below for your reference. Staff regularly share these expectations with students to reinforce our sun-safe practices at BPS.



HAT EXPECTATION

Sun Safety

A BPS broad-brimmed hat must be worn when outside by students in Terms 2-4 (inclusive). Staff are expected to model sun safety by wearing a broad-brimmed hat of their choice during Terms 2-4 (inclusive).

Hat Condition

Hats must not be intentionally damaged and must be free of graffiti.
If a student's hat is damaged, teachers are to notify parents.
Damaged hats must be replaced as soon as possible.

Purchasing Hats

New BPS hats can be purchased through the Front Office or via Qkr.

Short-Term Hat Loan (Mutual Exchange)

Students may participate in a short-term mutual exchange for a hat if required.
Each classroom will have two hats available for this purpose.
From 2026, mutual exchange for hats is no longer undertaken through the Front Office.

Parking along Wallace Street

Please refrain from parking along the stretch of Wallace Street between the bus road and crossing (school side) at school drop off and pick up.



Illness

Please help us keep our school community healthy by keeping children at home when they are unwell.



Students must remain at home for at least **24 hours** after their **last symptom**.

We strongly encourage families, where possible, to keep children home for **48 hours** to ensure they are fully recovered before returning.

If a child becomes unwell during the school day, families will be contacted to collect them.

Students who are absent for three days or more require a doctor's certificate.

Entering the Grounds

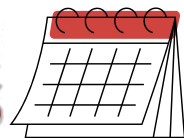

REGULAR CHECK-INS



At Balaklava Primary School, we are developing students who know what to do when they don't know what to do.

During Weeks 1 and 2, our learning disposition is **Reflective**, with a focus on **Regular Check-ins**.

Being reflective means thinking about our learning, recognising what is working well and deciding what we can do differently next time. These small moments of reflection help students become more independent learners and develop confidence when faced with new challenges.



Reflection helps us learn and grow by stopping, thinking and choosing what's best for our learning.

STUDENTS WILL REGULARLY ASK THEMSELVES:



What worked well today?



What challenged me?



What strategy helped me?



What will I do differently next time?

I CAN CHECK-IN USING MY THUMBS



THUMBS UP

Yes - I've got this!



THUMBS SIDWAYS

I think I understand but am a bit unsure.



THUMBS DOWN

I still require help.

This provides adults with immediate feedback to move on, repeat, or take a step back and re-teach a skill.

WHAT DOES A LEARNING CHECK-IN SOUND LIKE?



TEACHERS MIGHT SAY:

- "What strategy helped you today?"
- "What did you do when you became stuck?"
- "What are you most proud of?"
- "If you completed this task again, what would you change?"
- "What will you try next time?"



STUDENTS MIGHT SAY:

- "I kept trying until it made sense."
- "Using my notes really helped."
- "Next time I'll read the question more carefully."
- "I asked a learning partner after trying myself."
- "I know a strategy that will help me next time."

WHAT WE ARE STRIVING FOR AT SCHOOL



WE WILL SEE:

- Students regularly reflecting on their learning.
- Learners identifying strategies that helped them succeed.
- Students making changes after feedback.
- Children becoming more independent learners.
- Students confidently discussing their learning.



WE WILL HEAR:

- "That strategy worked well."
- "Next time I'll try something different."
- "I learnt from my mistake."
- "I know what helped me."
- "I'm getting better because I kept practising."



WHY REFLECTION MATTERS



- ✓ recognise their strengths and areas for growth
- ✓ understand that learning is a process
- ✓ become more independent
- ✓ make better learning choices
- ✓ develop confidence to tackle new challenges.

Reflection helps students build a toolbox of learning strategies they can use whenever they feel unsure.

HOW FAMILIES CAN SUPPORT AT HOME



ASK REFLECTIVE QUESTIONS

- What was the best part of your learning today?
- What challenged you?
- What helped you when you got stuck?
- What will you do differently next time?



CELEBRATE LEARNING, NOT JUST SUCCESS

- Praise your child for:
 - trying different strategies
 - learning from mistakes
 - improving over time
 - reflecting on their learning



ENCOURAGE CHILDREN TO THINK FIRST

Give your child time to explain their thinking before offering help.

WHAT YOU MIGHT NOTICE AT HOME



YOU MAY SEE:

- Your child talking about what they learnt.
- Greater confidence when facing challenges.
- Children making improvements after feedback.
- Increased independence with homework and everyday tasks.



YOU MAY HEAR:

- "That worked really well."
- "I'll try a different strategy."
- "I know what helped me."
- "Next time I'll do it this way."

AusAlert will be ready to use in October 2026, but before it launches, the system needs to be tested across Australia.

About the test

On Monday 27 July 2026, a test alert will be sent to all mobile devices in Australia. This includes most phones, and some smart watches and tablets.

South Australia (SA, incl. Broken Hill) - 1:30 pm

What to expect

At the time of the test, a single Critical AusAlert test will be sent to every mobile device in Australia. Everyone with a compatible phone or other device in Australia can expect to receive the alert.

Devices will vibrate and play a siren-like warning sound for about 10 seconds.

An AusAlert message will appear on device screens. It will clearly say it is a test.

Exactly how it appears will depend on your device type and operating system.

This is a TEST of AusAlert, Australia's new emergency warning system.
NO ACTION IS REQUIRED.

In an actual emergency, follow the instructions in the alert to keep yourself and others safe.

What is the Census?

Every five years, the Census counts every person and household in Australia.

It helps us understand how Australia is changing, and what we need now and in the future. It asks questions about your age, ancestry, what languages you speak and what you do for work.

If you know where you'll be on Census night, you can fill out the Census as soon as you get your instructions.

Your answers are private and protected by law.
We need to hear from everyone, because every answer matters.

You can complete the Census:



Online

Most households will get instructions when it's time to complete the Census.

1. Visit census.abs.gov.au
2. Enter your Census number and password
3. Complete the Census and submit

If you don't get instructions, you can request a Census number at census.abs.gov.au



Paper form

If you would prefer a paper form, you can request one from us.

1. Visit census.abs.gov.au/help or call our 24-hour automated paper form request service on 1800 130 250
2. Complete your paper form
3. Return to the ABS in the Reply Paid envelope provided



Visit from Census staff

Some people in remote areas, and people experiencing homelessness, will be visited by Census staff.

You need to complete the Census wherever you are staying on Census night.
Information and support will be available to help you complete the Census in your preferred way.
